

### Dog Off Lead Order

Order made pursuant to the **Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994** Section 26(2). Passed by Council resolution on 13 November 2006.

In accordance with the **Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994**, from 1 January 2007 the following areas in the City of Wyndham are designated as Off Lead Areas where dogs may be off lead provided that the conditions of use in this Order are complied with:

#### Werribee

- Bulban Road – north side, west of Flemington Crescent.
- Reserve between Diversion Weir and Redgum Close.
- Easement South Ring Road between Maltby Bypass and Duncans Road.
- Werribee River between Dequin Court and Hillrise Court.
- Werribee River track between Chirnside Park and Maltby Bypass.
- Princes Highway/Geelong Road, north side between both Westleigh Drives.
- Rear of the Civic Centre.
- Floodway between Ballan and Heaths Roads.

#### Werribee South

- Foreshore between jet ski ramp east to the start of Cunninghams Road.

#### Wyndham Vale

Presidents Park – from the Dog Obedience Club building to the riverbank and north to the park's boundary.

#### Hoppers Crossing

### **Transitional Period**

For a period of three months from 1 January 2007, existing "Off Lead Areas" in the City of Wyndham may continue to be used as "Off Lead Areas", provided that the conditions of use in this Order are complied with. At the end of the period being 1 April 2007 only the "Off Lead Areas" may continue to be used as "Off Lead Areas".

### **Conditions of Use**

For the purposes of these conditions of use and the enforcement of them, the person who is with the dog at an "Off Lead Area" is referred as "the handler". The handler of a dog using an "Off Lead Area" must comply with the following conditions of use:

- (1) The dog must be and remain "on lead":
  - (a) until both the handler and the dog have physically entered the "Off Lead Area"; and
  - (b) when the handler and the dog exit the "Off Lead Area".
- (2) The handler must have a dog lead in their possession at all times when in the "Off Lead Areas". The lead must be a chain, cord or leash and capable of restraining the dog.
- (3) The dog's current registration tag must be on the dog's collar whether the collar is on the dog or attached to the lead in the handler's possession.

- (4) When the dog is allowed "Off Lead", it must remain in both visual and audible range of the handler at all times so that the dog can be effectively recalled to the handler when required.
- (5) When another person or another dog is approaching, the handler must recall their dog and effectively restrain it until the other person or other dog has moved on to a safe distance.
- (6) At no time must the handler allow the dog to enter any waterways that may be within the "Off Lead Area".
- (7) The handler must ensure that the dog does not attack, chase or interfere with any wildlife in the "Off Lead Area".
- (8) The handler must not allow any dog under their control to be "Off Lead" if it is known to be:
  - dog aggressive;
  - person aggressive;
  - unsocialised with other dogs or animals; and
  - attracted to objects in motion such as bicycle tyres;
  - in season.
- (9) Clause 58 of Local Law 11 requires that a person using Council Land must comply with requirements applying to the use of that Council Land, including complying with any direction of an Authorised Officer. If an Authorised Officer prohibits a dog being off lead in an "Off Lead Area" until the Authorised Officer is satisfied that the handler is able to effectively recall and control the dog, the handler must not allow the dog to be off lead in an "Off Lead Area". The penalties for non-compliance under Local Law 11 apply if this condition is breached.
- (10) Clause 56 of Local Law 11 requires that the handler must not allow any part of the animal's waste to remain on any public place or road. The handler must have in their possession a device suitable for the removal of any waste left by the dog. The penalties for non-compliance under Local Law 11 apply if this condition is breached.

**Times**

Areas declared to be "Off Lead Areas" and signed as that may be used at any time provided that the conditions of use in this Order are complied with.

**Notification**

The resolution for the making of this Order was agreed to by Wyndham City Council on 13 November 2006.

affidavit of Charlie Davie, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the Act to enable the applicant to advertise for, recruit and train young people (aged 18–25) from migrant and refugee backgrounds in the design and delivery of sustainable projects.

In granting this exemption the Tribunal noted:

- Environment Victoria (EV) and the Centre for Multicultural Youth Issues (CMYI) have established a partnership project, Multicultural Leaders in Sustainability (MLS). The aim of MLS is to give rise to enhanced socio-environmental outcomes in migrant and refugee communities. The objectives of MLS are community development, capacity building, and to engage communities in practices and principles that enhance sustainable living. MLS seeks to act as a conduit for meaningful community engagement of migrant and refugee communities, and to facilitate positive interactions with the broader Australian community.
- Through training in leadership and sustainability, young people from migrant and refugee backgrounds will be empowered to act as leaders in educating their own communities about options for sustainable living. MLS is to work closely with local governments to identify communities and young people to participate in the program as well as to develop environmental programs tailored to the needs of the local community.
- Environment Victoria is the State's peak environmental non-government organization, with over 30 years experience in conservation issues across Victoria. EV works to build support for policies and practices that enable society to live more sustainably. EV does this through working with government, business, other non-government organisations and the community to develop visions and solutions for an ecologically sustainable future. Further, EV advocates for bolder government action on sustainability. EV focuses on five key campaigns: Sustainable Transport, Healthy Rivers, Sustainable Living, Climate Change and Zero Waste.

- The Centre for Multicultural Youth Issues is a state-wide community based organisation that advocates for the needs of young people from migrant and refugee backgrounds. To this end, Loddon Mallee Region, Disability Services has identified funds to support the employment of two Indigenous trainees which is a program commitment outlined in the Region's Aboriginal Services plan and the Department's Indigenous employment plan.
- The current utilisation rate of disability supports by Indigenous Australians is below that of other Australians. By increasing the number of Indigenous employees engaged in Disability Services it is anticipated that over time this will lead to more Indigenous Australians utilising disability support services. It will also assist Disability Services to deliver these supports in a culturally appropriate way.
- The traineeships aim to increase Indigenous employment within the Loddon Mallee Region. It is expected that trainees will commence in 2007.
- The primary purpose of trainees is to provide support and assistance to staff at various community houses to assist people with a disability with daily activities of living. The aim is to transition trainees into a Disability Developmental Services Officer role.
- The applicant recognises its responsibilities towards the employment of Indigenous staff. The Region has an Indigenous population of 4,500. Currently the Region employs 15 Indigenous staff, which is 1.7% of the total staff of the Region. The region has an aim to increase employment numbers of Indigenous people with a target figure of 3.0%. This

initiative is designed to create a career pathway for Indigenous people that may not have been considered previously.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption to the applicant from the operation of Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the Act to enable the applicant to advertise for and appoint an Indigenous person to two fixed term traineeship positions within Disability Services.

Amendment C41

The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment C41 to the Whitehorse Planning Scheme.

The Amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The Amendment which applies to 14 Federation Street, Box Hill:

- Rezones the land from an Industrial 1 Zone to partly a Residential 1 Zone and partly a Special Use Zone Schedule 3.
- Deletes and replaces Schedule 3 (Extractive Industry) to the Special Use Zone with a new Schedule 3 to the Special Use Zone (14 Federation Street, Box Hill).

- Applies to part of the land a new Schedule 3 to the Special Use Zone that recognises the possible long-term future use for residential purposes pending resolution of environmental issues.
- Introduces a new Local Planning Policy for the land (Clause 22.15) that seeks to ensure that any future use and development is in accordance with any Statements of Environmental Audit and to recognise its potential for future residential development following the resolution of environmental issues.
- Enables the planning authority to issue a planning permit (WH/12727) under the provisions of section 96A of the **Planning and Environment Act 1987** for the development of part of the land for 79 dwellings and the creation of a carriageway easement.

Notice of Making a Local Law  
General Local Law (Amendment)  
Local Law 2006

On 28 November 2006 Greater Geelong City Council made a new local law, to be referred to as the General Local Law (Amendment) Local Law 2006. The following information about the local law is provided in accordance with section 119(3) of the **Local Government Act 1989**.

### Purpose of the Local Law

The purpose of the local law is to:

- provide for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district;
- promote a physical and social environment free from hazards to health, in which the residents of the municipal district can enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community; and
- prevent and suppress nuisances which may adversely affect the enjoyment of life within the municipal district or the health, safety and welfare of persons within the municipal district.

### General Purport of the Local Law

This amends Council's General Local Law 2005 by:

- making it an offence for a person to camp or allow any other person to camp in any motor vehicle left standing on a road;
- making it an offence for an owner or occupier of land to install or allow to be installed (or cause to be retained and active) on land an intruder alarm unless there is legibly and prominently displayed close to the front door of the premises on the land the name and telephone number of a person who can be contacted if the intruder alarm is activated;
- making it an offence for a person to possess an aerosol spray container on
  - any road or Council land or in any public place, with the intention of using it to deface any structure or property; or
  - private land, unless he or she has a consent of the owner or occupier of that private land;

making it an offence for a person who offers for sale aerosol spray paint containers, or owns, operates or manages a business from the premises on which an aerosol spray container is offered for sale, to store or display (or cause or allow to be stored or displayed) any aerosol spray paint container in an area which is accessible to the public;

making it an offence for a person to sell, deliver, give or cause to be sold, delivered or given to a person under the age of 18 years any aerosol spray paint container unless a specified exception is satisfied;

- making it an offence for a person to consume alcohol, or have in his or her possession an unsealed container of alcohol, on Council land or in a public place;
- creating an offence for anti-social behaviour on a road or Council land or in a public space;
- making it an offence for a person to cause the sound system of a motor vehicle to be used so as to emit offensive noise, and extending liability to the owner and driver of the motor vehicle on specified circumstances;
- making it an offence for a driver of a motor vehicle to drive or use a motor vehicle on the road if the sound system of that motor vehicle emits offensive noise, and extending liability to the owner of the motor vehicle in specified circumstances;
- making it an offence for the owner of a motor vehicle to give a false statement as to the name and address of the person who was in charge of the motor vehicle at a specified time;
- making it an offence for a person on a road or Council land or in a public place to emit, or cause to be emitted, such a level of noise as to materially interfere with the reasonable comfort of any person occupying premises which abut the road, Council land or public place;
- making it an offence for a person to act contrary to any indication or direction given in any sign installed by or on behalf of Council;
- making it an offence for a person not to comply with a direction given by an authorised officer to a person contravening or failing to comply with any provision of General Local Law 2005;

- fixing new Infringement Notice penalties for various offences against General Local Law 2005.
