1. **Title**
This Order is called the **Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 214) 2013**.
2. **Authorising provision**
This Order is made under section 3 of the **Administrative Arrangements Act 1983**.
3. **Commencement**
This Order takes effect on 16 December 2011.
4. **Definitions**
In this Order –
‘**Body**’ means Minister, Department or officer;
‘**instrument**’ includes contract and agreement;
‘**Old Body**’ means a Body specified in Column 1 of the Schedule;
‘**New Body**’ means a Body specified in Column 3 of the Schedule;
‘**Schedule**’ means Schedule to this Order;
‘**transaction**’ includes –
 - (a) agreement, bond, contract, deed or other consensual arrangement; and
 - (b) action, appeal, arbitration, prosecution or other legal proceeding; and
 - (c) assignment, charge, lease, mortgage, transfer or other dealing with property; and
 - (d) loan, guarantee, indemnity or other dealing with money; and
 - (e) approval, consent, delegation, direction, licence, order, permit, requirement or other authority; and
 - (f) notice; and
 - (g) any other act, entitlement or liability at law.
5. **Construction of references**
In respect of each item in the Schedule, a reference to an Old Body –
 - (a) in a provision of an Act specified in Column 2 of the Schedule; or
 - (b) in a statutory instrument or other instrument made under an Act specified in Column 2 of the Schedule;
 - (c) in respect of any other matter or thing done under a provision of an Act specified in Column 2 of the Schedule; or
 - (d) in an instrument specified in Column 2 of the Schedule –
is taken to be a reference to the New Body.
6. **Saving of existing transactions**
If a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body before this Order takes effect –
 - (a) the transaction shall continue in the same way it would have continued if this Order had not been made; and

SPECIAL

- (b) the transaction may be given effect to, or enforced or completed, by or in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have been given effect to, enforced or completed, by or in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.

7. Keeping financial accounts and reports

- (1) The Secretary, Department of Primary Industries must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 23 December 2011 in respect of a function under an Act specified in –
- (a) item 1 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (b) item 4 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (c) item 7 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- as if the function had not been transferred.
- (2) The Secretary, Department of Primary Industries and the Secretary of Sustainability and Environment must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 23 December 2011 in respect of a function under an Act specified in:
- (a) item 10 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (b) item 13 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (c) item 16 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (d) item 19 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item –
- as if the function had not been transferred.
- (3) The Secretary, Department of Primary Industries or the Secretary of Sustainability and Environment or both must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 23 December 2011 in respect of a function under an Act specified in –
- (a) item 22 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (b) item 25 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (c) item 28 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (d) item 31 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item –
- as if the function had not been transferred.
- (4) The Secretary, Department of Sustainability and Environment must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 23 December 2011 in respect of a function under an Act specified in –
- (a) item 34 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (b) item 37 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (c) item 40 in the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item –
- as if the function had not been transferred.

8. Providing financial accounts and reports

A Secretary to a Department to which a function is transferred must, if requested by a Secretary to a Department who is an Old Body, provide that Old Body with any financial accounts and records or other information required to enable the Old Body to comply with clause 7.

- (b) in a statutory instrument or other instrument made under an Act specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, Table 4 or Table 5 of the Schedule; or
- (c) in respect of any other matter or thing done under a provision of an Act specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, Table 4 or Table 5 of the Schedule; or
- (d) in an instrument specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, Table 4 or Table 5 of the Schedule –

is taken to be a reference to the New Body.

6. Saving of existing transactions

If a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body before this Order takes effect –

- (b) the transaction may be given effect to, or enforced or completed, by or in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have been given effect to, enforced or completed, by or in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.

1. Title

This Order is called the **Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 217) 2013**.

2. Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 3 of the **Administrative Arrangements Act 1983**.

3. Commencement

(1) Subject to subclause (2), this Order takes effect on 3 June 2013.

(2) This Order, as it applies to or in respect of an item in Table 2 of the Schedule, takes effect on 1 July 2013.

4. Definitions

In this Order –

‘**Body**’ means Minister, Department or officer;

‘**instrument**’ includes contract and agreement;

‘**Old Body**’ means a Body specified in Column 1 of the Schedule;

‘**New Body**’ means a Body specified in Column 3 of the Schedule;

‘**Schedule**’ means Schedule to this Order;

‘**transaction**’ includes –

- (a) agreement, bond, contract, deed or other consensual arrangement; and
- (b) action, appeal, arbitration, prosecution or other legal proceeding; and
- (c) assignment, charge, lease, mortgage, transfer or other dealing with property; and
- (d) loan, guarantee, indemnity or other dealing with money; and
- (e) approval, consent, delegation, direction, licence, order, permit, requirement or other authority; and
- (f) notice; and
- (g) any other act, entitlement or liability at law.

5. Construction of references

In respect of each item in the Schedule, a reference to an Old Body –

- (a) in a provision of an Act specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1 or Table 2 of the Schedule; or
- (b) in a statutory instrument or other instrument made under an Act specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1 or Table 2 of the Schedule; or
- (c) in respect of any other matter or thing done under a provision of an Act specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1 or Table 2 of the Schedule; or
- (d) in an instrument specified in Column 2 of an item in Table 1 or Table 2 of the Schedule –

is taken to be a reference to the New Body.

6. Saving of existing transactions

If a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body before this Order takes effect –

- (a) the transaction shall continue in the same way it would have continued if this Order had not been made; and
- (b) the transaction may be given effect to, or enforced or completed, by or in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have been given effect to, enforced or completed, by or in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.

7. Financial reporting for the Department of Planning and Community Development and the Department of Primary Industries

- (1) Despite the transfer of staff from the Department of Planning and Community Development on 3 June 2013 by a Declaration made under section 30 of the **Public Administration Act 2004**, and the transfer of functions from the Department of Planning and Community Development, a report of operations and financial statements must be prepared in accordance with Part 7 of the **Financial Management Act 1994**, in relation to all of the functions, transactions, balances, responsibilities and activities of the Department of Planning and Community Development for the financial year ending on 30 June 2013, as if no staff or functions had been transferred.
- (2) Despite the transfer of staff from the Department of Primary Industries on 3 June 2013 by a Declaration made under section 30 of the **Public Administration Act 2004**, and the transfer of functions from the Department of Primary Industries, a report of operations and financial statements must be prepared in accordance with Part 7 of the **Financial Management Act 1994**, in relation to all of the functions, transactions, balances, responsibilities and activities of the Department of Primary Industries, for the financial year ending on 30 June 2013, as if no staff or functions had been transferred.
- (3) Despite the transfer of staff from the Department of Primary Industries and the Department of Planning and Community Development on 3 June 2013 by a Declaration made under section 30 of the **Public Administration Act 2004**, and the transfer of functions from the Department of Primary Industries and the Department of Planning and Community Development, a report of operations and financial statements in accordance with Part 7 of the **Financial Management Act 1994** of a Department to which Department of Primary Industries or Department of Planning and Community Development staff or functions were transferred must not include functions, transactions, balances, responsibilities or activities which are included in the Department of Primary Industries or the Department of Planning and Community Development report of operations or financial statements for the financial year ending on 30 June 2013.

8. Keeping financial accounts and reports

- (1) The Secretary, Department of Planning and Community Development must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 30 June 2013 in respect of a function under an Act specified in:
 - (a) item 1 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (b) item 5 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (c) item 6 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
 - (d) item 8 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;

- (e) item 10 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (f) item 12 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (g) item 14 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item; or
- (h) item 16 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item,

as if the function had not been transferred.

- (2) The Secretary, Department of Primary Industries must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 30 June 2013 in respect of a function under an Act specified in:

- (a) item 18 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (b) item 20 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (c) item 22 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (d) item 23 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (e) item 25 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item; or
- (f) item 27 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item,

as if the function had not been transferred.

- (3) The Secretary, Department of State Development, Business and Innovation must ensure that financial accounts are kept and records are provided for the purposes of the **Financial Management Act 1994** until 30 June 2013 in respect of a function under an Act specified in:

- (a) item 29 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item;
- (b) item 31 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item; or
- (c) item 33 in Table 1 of the Schedule that is transferred to the New Body specified in that item,

as if the function had not been transferred.

9. Providing financial accounts and reports

A Secretary to a Department to which a function is transferred must, if requested by a Secretary to a Department who is an Old Body, provide that Old Body with any financial accounts and records or other information required to enable the Old Body to comply with clause 7 or clause 8.
