



Planning and Environment Act 1987BASS COAST PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Preparation of Amendment Amendment C82

The Bass Coast Shire Council has prepared Amendment C82 to the Bass Coast Planning Scheme.

The Amendment affects land throughout Bass Coast Shire that has been identified as affected by riverine flooding, or predicted coastal inundation. Small 'islands' of areas that are unaffected but completely surrounded by the mapping have also been included, as have properties where the mapping shows that access has been affected by the mapping.

The Amendment proposes to make the following changes:

Mapping Changes

 The Amendment deletes the current LSIO maps which apply to Powlett River and Pioneer Bay and replaces them with new flood and coastal inundation mapping.

Ordinance Changes

- Clause 21.02 'Profile of the Bass Coast Shire' is amended so that reference to sea level rise is consistent with state policy. That is, planning for seal level rise of at least 0.8 m by 2100.
- Clause 21.03 'Key Issues' is amended to include riverine flooding and coastal inundation as environmental hazards.
- Clause 21.04 'Vision' is amended so that an appropriate response to environmental hazards is listed as a vision for the environment.
- Clause 21.05 'Settlement' is amended to include a new objective which seeks to discourage inappropriate development in areas where an environmental hazard has been identified.
- Clause 21.07 'Environment' is amended to include a reference to strongly discouraging development that affects the natural flow path of waterways.
- Clause 21.10 'Local Areas' is amended so that settlements that are affected by the LSIO include strategies for planning for an appropriate response to environmental hazards and that development is responsive to identified flood and coastal inundation risks identified in the LSIO.

Overlay' – the Schedule to the Overlay and Schedule 2 to the Overlay are deleted. They are replaced with one Schedule to the Overlay that addresses all areas that will be affected by the LSIO mapping.

Notice of Preparation of Amendment Amendment C92

The Maroondah City Council has prepared Amendment C92 to the Maroondah Planning Scheme.





1 Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare restricted areas for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly in the Yarra Valley in Victoria, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements, which are to operate in relation to each area.

2 Authorising Provision

This Order is made under section 32 of the Plant Biosecurity Act 2010 (the Act).

3 Definitions

In this Order -

'accreditation program' means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

'authorised person' means a person authorised by the Department of Environment and Primary Industries;

'inspector' means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

'Queensland Fruit Fly' means the exotic pest Bactrocera tryoni (Froggatt);

'Queensland Fruit Fly host produce' means any fruit or vegetable, or plant in fruit listed in Schedule 1;

'Queensland Fruit Fly host material' means any Queensland Fruit Fly host produce or used packaging;

'used packaging' means any packaging that has contained Queensland Fruit Fly host produce;

'Yarra Valley Pest Free Places of Production' means specific properties in the Yarra Valley, as described in Schedule 2.

4 Restricted areas for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly

Restricted areas for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly, known as the Yarra Valley Pest Free Places of Production, are declared to be the areas described in Schedule 2.

5 Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) The movement into any part of the Yarra Valley Pest Free Places of Production of any Oueensland Fruit Fly host material is prohibited.
- (2) Sub-clause (1) does not apply if the Queensland Fruit Fly host material:
 - (a) was grown and packed, or last used, in the Greater Sunraysia Pest Free Area, or an area declared as a restricted area under section 32 of the Act for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly; or
 - (b) is accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the material has been treated in a manner approved by the Chief Plant Health Manager; or
 - (c) is packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program under which the material is certified; or

- (d) is accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the material has been treated in a manner approved by the Chief Plant Health Manager: or
- is consigned in any other manner approved by the Chief Plant Health Manager. (e)
- (3) Owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 2 must, on written instruction from an inspector, take action to control Queensland Fruit Fly, including stripping Oueensland Fruit Fly host produce from plants, and treating or destroying plants.
