

CORANGAMITE SHIRE

General Local Law No. 1 2015 and Livestock Local Law No. 2 2015

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to section 119 of the **Local Government Act 1989** (the Act), Corangamite Shire Council, at its 15 December 2015 Ordinary Meeting, resolved to make new Local Laws entitled General Local Law No. 1 2015 and Livestock Local Law No. 2 2015.

The Local Laws supersede General Local Law No. 1 2009 and Livestock Local Law No. 2 2009.

The proposed Local Laws are being made under section 111(1) of the Act and will operate throughout the municipal district of Corangamite Shire Council.

The purpose and general purport of General Local Law No. 1 2015 is to provide for:

- peace, order and good governance of the municipality;
- a safe and healthy environment so that the community within the municipality can enjoy a quality of life that meets its expectations;
- the control of activities, events, practices and behaviour on land which are dangerous or unsightly or could give rise to a nuisance or detriment to persons and the amenity of the neighbourhood;
- safe and fair use and enjoyment of public places;
- protection and enhancement of the amenity and environment of the municipality;
- fair and reasonable use and enjoyment of private land;
- protection of assets vested in the Council;
- regulation of behaviour in public places;
- controlling the consumption and possession of liquor in various circumstances and places and at various times;
- preventing obstructions to traffic and pedestrians from private land;
- facilitating the provision of equitable access to general public services which enhance the environment and quality of life in the municipal district;
- regulating the use of caravans and temporary dwellings;
- the making of decisions in the best interest of the whole community to maintain suitable infrastructure and to provide a sense of community;
- the control and regulation of the collection of wastes;
- uniform and fair administration of this Local Law; and
- best practice local law making principles of accessibility, accountability, compliance, consistency, currency, efficiency, enforceability, necessity and transparency.

The purpose and general purport of Livestock Local Law No. 2 2015 is to:

- regulate the movement and driving of livestock through and within the municipal district and the grazing of livestock within the municipal district;
- minimise damage to road pavements, formations, drainage, vegetation and surrounding areas arising from livestock;
- minimise the spread of livestock disease and noxious weeds in the municipal district;
- provide for the welfare of livestock when being driven, grazed or moved;

- provide for measures to alert other road users to the presence on roads of livestock in the municipal district in the interests of safe use of roads;
- regulate the adequacy of fencing of livestock and put in place mechanisms for rectifying inadequate fencing;
- make provision for fees or charges relating to the impounding of livestock and all other costs incidental thereto and for road use by livestock within the municipal district;
- prescribe penalties for contravention of any provisions of this Local Law; and
- provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district including in particular the administration of Council's powers and functions.

COUNCIL ORDERS MADE UNDER SECTION 10A AND 26
OF THE **DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT 1994**

At its meeting on 15 December 2015 Yarra City Council resolved to make the following Order pursuant to section 26(2) of the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**.

1. Revocation

- (1) All previous Orders made by Council under section 26 of the **Domestic Animals Act 1994** are revoked.

2. That as per section 10A of the Domestic Animals Act 1994, it will not, after 22 December 2013, register or renew the registration of a cat unless the cat:

- (a) is de-sexed; or
(b) is exempted under this Act from any requirements to be de-sexed.

3. Dogs must be under effective control

- (1) The Owner of any dog must keep the dog under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash (not exceeding 2 metres in length) held by the Owner and attached to the dog while the dog is in a Public Place except where that Public Place is a Designated Reserve or Prohibited Area.

4. Prohibited Areas

- (1) A dog must not enter or remain in any Prohibited Area.
(2) The prohibition under Sub-clause (1) applies in a Prohibited Area regardless of whether or not the dog is on a chain, cord or leash.

5. Owner's obligations in a Designated Reserve

- (1) A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve if the Owner:
- (a) does not allow the dog to worry, threaten or attack any person or animal;
 - (b) carries a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 2 metres in length sufficient to bring the dog under control by placing the dog on the chain, cord or leash if the dog behaves in a manner which worries, threatens or attacks any person or animal;

- (c) remains close enough to the dog so as to be able to immediately bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash;
- (d) brings the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash immediately upon the dog commencing to worry, threaten or attack any person or animal;
- (e) keeps the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash (not exceeding 2 metres in length) held by the Owner and attached to the dog whenever the dog is within 10 metres of:
 - (i) an unfenced playground area;
 - (ii) a barbecue or picnic facility;
 - (iii) a sporting oval which is being used for an organised sporting event (including training), an authorised school event or other organised public event;
 - (iv) any skate park or BMX facility;
 - (v) any other authorised event; and
 - (vi) any Play or Exercise equipment.

6. Commercial Dog Walkers

- (1) Commercial Dog Walkers must keep all dogs in their care on leash at all times except when in a designated and fenced off-leash area.

7. Shared Paths (as defined under the Road Safety Road Rules 2009)

- (1) Dogs are required to be on lead on shared pathways and 5 metres either side, even if the pathways run through off-lead areas.

8. Meaning of words

In this Order:

Designated Reserve means any reserve specified in Schedule 1 of this Order.

Owner has the same meaning as in the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**.

Play or Exercise equipment means any item or facility installed by Council and designed to be used by children or adults.

Prohibited Area means:

- (a) any sporting oval when an organised sporting event (including training) is in progress; and
- (b) the places specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.

Public Place has the meaning given to it in the **Summary Offences Act 1966**, and includes all streets, roads, footways, reserves, lanes, parks, schools, public halls and markets.

THE AUSTRALIAN COMPUTER SOCIETY PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS SCHEME**1 Occupational association**

- 1.1 The Australian Computer Society Professional Standards Scheme (the scheme) is a scheme under the Act prepared by the Australian Computer Society Inc (ACS) whose national office address is Level 11, 50 Carrington Street, Sydney, NSW, 2000.

2 Persons to Whom the Scheme Applies

- 2.1 The Scheme will apply to ACS members who qualify as Certified Computer Professionals unless exempted by ACS. A list of Certified Computer Professionals will be published on the ACS web site.
- 2.2 This Scheme also applies to all persons to whom the Scheme applied under Clause 2.1 at the time of any act or omission giving rise to occupational liability.

3 Limitation of liability

SCHEDULE TO THE ORDER IN COUNCIL

- 1. Appointment Arrangements**
Under section 2.5.6(4) of the **Education and Training Reform Act 2006** (the Act), a member is appointed on a part-time basis.
- 2. Period of Appointment**
The appointments are from the date of the order to 30 June 2018 (both dates inclusive).
- 3. Duties and responsibilities of the position**
The functions of the Authority are contained in section 2.5.3 of the Act and are, in summary, to develop: policies, criteria and standards for curriculum, assessments and courses for school students, including courses leading to recognised qualifications.
- 4. Termination Arrangements**
Section 2.5.6(5) of the Act states that a member may resign from office by delivering to the Governor in Council a signed letter of resignation.
Section 2.5.6(6) of the Act states that the Governor in Council may at any time remove a member from office.
- 5. Payment Provisions**
Schedule 2, Item 3(1) of the Act states that a member or acting member of an authority, other than a member who holds a full-time Government office, or a full-time position in the public service, teaching service or with a statutory authority (other than a university) is entitled to

receive the remuneration and fees that are fixed in the member's instrument of appointment or are fixed from time to time by the Governor in Council for that member.

Mr Moore and Ms Dillon are eligible for remuneration of \$3075 per annum.

6. Superannuation Obligations

Superannuation will be paid in accordance with the **Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1992** (Cth).

7. Travel and Personal Expenses arrangements

Schedule 2, Item 3(2) of the Act states that each member or acting member of an authority is entitled to receive the personal and travelling expenses that are fixed in the member's instrument of appointment or are fixed from time to time by the Governor in Council.


