





**Occupational Health and Safety Act 2004****OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS 2007****Exemption**

This exemption from compliance with a provision of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007 (the OHS Regulations) is granted by the Victorian WorkCover Authority under regulation 7.2.2(1) of the OHS Regulations, in the form required by regulation 7.2.9:

The following class of person is exempt from compliance with regulation 3.6.1 of the OHS Regulations, which prohibits persons from doing any high risk work unless he or she holds an appropriate high risk work licence in relation to the work.

**Exempt class of person**

Non-Australian residents employed or engaged by Formula One Management Limited or a Formula One racing team to handle freight for the Australian Formula One Grand Prix held at Albert Park Grand Prix circuit, Albert Park, Victoria (the international operators).

**High risk work that may be performed by the exempt class of person**

Operation of a fork-lift truck operated by a person who does not hold a high risk work licence for the licence class of fork-lift truck operation licence in Part 2 of Schedule 3 of the OHS Regulations.

**Conditions**

In accordance with regulations 7.2.5 and 7.2.8 of the OHS Regulations the following conditions are imposed in granting the exemption which must be observed and apply to all work:

1. This exemption applies to only those persons who are non-Australian residents engaged or employed by Formula One Management Ltd or a Formula One (F1) racing team to operate fork-lift trucks at the Australian Formula One Grand Prix held at Albert Park Grand Prix circuit, Albert Park, Victoria (the Grand Prix).
2. The Grand Prix includes the period of fourteen days leading up to the Australian Formula One Grand Prix race and fourteen days after the conclusion of the Australian Formula One Grand Prix race.
3. This exemption is limited to two international operators per racing team, and two international operators who are directly employed by Formula One Management Ltd.
4. This exemption commences fourteen days before the start of the Grand Prix and expires fourteen days after the completion of the Grand Prix held in the years 2016, 2017 and 2018 respectively unless earlier revoked by WorkSafe Victoria.
5. This exemption shall only apply to the designated fork-lift operating areas in accordance with those areas specified in the AGPC's exemption application and referred to as 'Forklift Exemption Plan 1 Defined Boundary – Drawing Number APP016-C-DWG-113 dated 15 December 2015'.
6. The International Freight Logistics Operations Plan (the Plan) as provided in the AGPC's exemption application must be implemented.
7. Prior to being eligible to use a fork-lift, an international operator is to be assessed using the WorkSafe endorsed Performance Observation Checklist, Reference No. F03389 for fork-lifts (Performance Observation Checklist).
8. Once deemed competent under the Performance Observation Checklist, the international operator must be issued with a Fork-lift Competency Card under the name of the Registered Training Organisation (RTO) appointed by the AGPC to conduct fork-lift operation competency assessments on its behalf.
9. Fork-lift Competency Cards are to be valid for the period of the exemption.
10. Unless required by WorkSafe, any international operator who holds a valid Fork-lift Competency Card for 2016 will not require re-assessment to operate a fork-lift at the Grand Prix in 2016, 2017 and 2018 within the stated exemption periods.

11. WorkSafe Victoria retains the right to suspend, cancel and/or request re-assessment of any international operator should they be found to be operating a fork-lift in an unsafe manner or if an operator is involved in an incident or fails to adhere to any direction given by WorkSafe Victoria whilst covered by this exemption.
12. Each individual Fork-lift Competency Card must be issued with an identifying number and include the operator's name, date of issue and date of expiry.
13. All international operators must keep their Fork-lift Competency Card on them at all times whilst operating a fork-lift at the Grand Prix.
14. Both electronic and hard copies of the completed Performance Observation Checklists of all international operators must be kept by the AGPC.
15. An electronic database must be established by the AGPC to keep a record of details of all international operators issued with a Fork-lift Competency Card, including card number and the information set out in paragraphs 12, 16 and 17. This information must be readily available to and provided to WorkSafe Victoria on request.
16. The AGPC must ensure that all persons applying for a Fork-lift Competency Card provide original identification, which includes a colour photograph.
17. The AGPC must ensure that all persons applying for a Fork-lift Competency Card provide an original and valid (not expired) fork-lift licence or certificate of competency from country of issue.
18. The AGPC must provide WorkSafe Victoria with a complete list of the names of all international operators who have been issued with Competency Cards within three working days.
19. The AGPC is to ensure that all documentation pertaining to an individual's Fork-lift Competency Card is kept in a secure location.
20. A physical boundary must be erected to restrict unauthorised access to, and traffic egress from, the designated operating areas for fork-lift activities. Security personnel must be provided to enforce the secured area.
21. An AGPC supervisor or project manager must be present at all times that fork-lift operating activities are taking place at the Grand Prix.
22. A suitably competent safety officer/observer, independent of Formula One Management Ltd and the F1 racing teams, must be present at all times that fork-lift operating activities are taking place at the Grand Prix to monitor and enforce the implementation of any safety requirements and plans and the initiation of corrective action in the event those requirements and plans are not correctly or fully implemented.
23. Any international operator who holds a valid Fork-lift Competency Card for 2016 will not require re-assessment to operate a fork-lift at the Grand Prix in 2017 and 2018 within the stated exemption periods.

In accordance with regulation 7.2.5 of the OHS Regulations, the Victorian WorkCover Authority is satisfied that, provided the above conditions are met, the work that is the subject of this exemption can be performed as safely by a person who does not hold a relevant high risk work licence as it could be performed by a person who holds such a licence.

This exemption starts from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Gazette.



The Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) was established to provide regulation which ensures quality education and training is delivered by the providers it registers in Victoria, and to promote informed choice regarding the education and training decisions of Victorians. The VRQA is also responsible for the regulation of apprenticeships and traineeships in Victoria.

**4. Termination Arrangements**

Under section 4.2.4(3) of the **Education and Training Reform Act 2006** (the Act), an appointed member may resign from office by delivering to the Governor in Council a signed letter of resignation. Under section 4.2.4(4) of the Act, the Governor in Council may at any time remove an appointed member from office.

**5. Payment Provisions**

Under Schedule 2, section 3(1) of the Act, a member of the Authority, other than one who holds a full-time Government office, or a full-time position in the public service, teaching service, or with another statutory authority (other than a university), is entitled to receive the remuneration and fees that are fixed in the member's instrument of appointment or are fixed from time to time by the Governor in Council for that member.

The appointees are entitled to be remunerated at the rate of \$37,422 per annum for the Chairperson and members at the rate of \$14,698 per annum. In addition, in recognition for additional committee work, payments of \$4,600 per annum are made to the VRQA Chairperson and members at the end of each financial year.

**6. Superannuation Obligations**

Superannuation will be paid in accordance with the **Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1992**.

**7. Travel and Personal Expenses arrangements**

Under schedule 2, section 3(2) of the Act, each member or acting member of the Authority is entitled to receive the personal and travelling expenses that are fixed in the member's instrument of appointment or are fixed from time to time by the Governor in Council for that member. 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
