





Amendment C194

The Greater Dandenong City Council has prepared Amendment C194 to the Greater Dandenong Planning Scheme.

The land affected by the Amendment is 10 Homeleigh Road, Keysborough, and 209 Chapel Road, Keysborough.

The Amendment proposes to delete the notation 'Proposed Primary School Site' from Map 1 – Outline Development Plan of Schedule 5 to the Development Plan Overlay to enable the use of the General Residential Zone 2 in a manner that achieves the objectives of the zone.


