

1. Councillors; or
2. the Chief Executive Officer;
3. a senior officer occupying the position of Chief Financial Officer, Director Corporate Services, or Executive Manager Corporate Administration and Customer Service;
4. or any combination of persons referred to in Clauses 1, 2, or 3 except that not more than one of the persons described in Clause 3 may witness the affixing of the Common Seal to a document.

Delegation to the Chief Executive Officer

Delegates the power to the Chief Executive Officer to authorise the use of the Common Seal in certain circumstances.

Offences

Provides for the establishment of offences against the Local Law and the application of penalties.

Revocation of existing Local Law

Provides for the repeal and revocation of the existing Local Law of the same name, adopted in 2006.

INTERIM EXEMPTION

Application No. H33/2016

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the Act) by Positive Women (the applicant). The application for exemption is to enable the applicant to advertise for and employ only a woman in the role of Health Promotion and Communications Officer and for women applicants living with HIV to be given preference in the selection process (the exempt conduct).

Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the affidavit of Alison Boughey, and having heard from the applicant at a directions hearing on 29 April 2016, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an interim exemption from sections 16, 18, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct until the application is finally heard and determined.

In granting this exemption the Tribunal noted:

- The applicant is Australia's only community-based organisation specifically funded to support and empower women living with HIV. The applicant does this through the provision of peer support, information, referral services, practical support and advocacy. Recognising the impact gender has on the way women experience HIV, the applicant has, for over 25 years, responded to the changing needs and emerging issues of Victorian women living with HIV.
- The Health Promotion and Communications Officer role includes working to support women to reduce their isolation, enhance their community engagement and improve their wellbeing. The position holder is required to represent the organisation in high-level forums, conferences and networking events when required. As a member of a small team, the Health Promotion/Communications role also involves front-line contact and provision of direct support to women living with HIV. The position statement for the role includes a key duty working directly with individual women living with HIV.

- I am not currently satisfied that an exemption applies to the exempt conduct. Accordingly, in the absence of an exemption, the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination.
- When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (Charter). Arguably, this exemption limits the right to privacy, the right to equality and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination of men who wish to be employed in the Health and Communications Officer role or women who are not living with HIV who might be disadvantaged in applying. I am satisfied that for the purposes of this interim exemption, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.

The Tribunal hereby grants an interim exemption from the operation of sections 16, 18, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 5 August 2016.

Arguably, this exemption limits the right to equality and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination of men or women who would wish to participate in an event limited to the other gender. I am satisfied that for the purposes of this further interim exemption, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.

The Tribunal hereby grants an interim exemption from the operation of sections 44, 71, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.


