MAKING OF LOCAL LAW **Local Government Act 1989** – Section 119

At its meeting on 16 June 2017, the Council resolved to sign and seal the Meeting Procedure and Common Seal Local Law No. 7, 2017.

Purpose of the Meeting Procedure and Common Seal Local Law:

This Local Law provides procedures relating to the conduct of Council and special committee meetings and applies requirements concerning the use of the Council's Common Seal as required by the **Local Government Act 1989**.

General Purport of the Local Law:

The general purport of the Local Law includes prescribing:

- the public notice requirements applying to Council and special committee meetings of the Council;
- how voting is undertaken, including for the election of the Mayor;
- prescribing the matters to be included in agendas for Council meetings and the order of business at meetings;
- formal motions and other procedural matters relating to Council meetings;
- provisions concerning minutes of meetings of the Council, special committees and assembly of Councillors; and

- the enforcement and penalty provisions of the existing Local Law to make the provisions consistent with State legislation.

NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

Heritage Regulations 2017 and Heritage (Underwater Cultural Heritage) Regulations 2017

In accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, I, Richard Wynne, Minister for Planning, and Minister responsible for administering the **Heritage Act 2017**, give notice of the preparation of a regulatory impact statement in relation to the Heritage Regulations 2017 and Heritage (Underwater Cultural Heritage) Regulations 2017 (proposed regulations).

The objectives of the proposed regulations are to:

- (a) prescribe activities which are prohibited in, on or near a protected zone
- (b) prescribe activities which are prohibited in, on or near a historic shipwreck, a registered shipwreck, a historic shipwreck artefact, or a registered shipwreck artefact
- (c) prescribe forms and documents for the purposes of the **Heritage Act 2017**
- (d) prescribe fees payable for permit, consent and certificate applications under the **Heritage Act 2017**
- (e) exempt particular classes of people from certain fees
- (f) authorise the Heritage Council to waive certain fees
- (g) prescribe infringement offences and infringement penalties
- (h) prescribe penalties for undertaking activities prohibited by the proposed regulations
- (i) prescribe other matters for the purposes of the **Heritage Act 2017**.

Through stakeholder consultation, and multi-criterion analysis, the regulatory impact statement finds the preferred option is to base the proposed regulations on the Heritage (General) Regulations 2015, Heritage (Historic Shipwrecks) Regulations 2007 and the Heritage (Infringement Notice) Regulations 2012 with amendments including:

- (a) threshold changes for some permits for works/activities to registered places or objects
- (b) permits to access protected zones to dive are now charged on a per diver basis (rather than per entry) to make it fairer for small groups
- (c) archaeology consents include reduced fees to construct a single dwelling
- (d) fee exemptions and waivers have been expanded, and community groups are now exempt from payment of a range of fees.

Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING THE ENTRY OR IMPORTATION INTO VICTORIA OF MATERIALS WHICH ARE HOSTS OF PYRIFORM SCALE**

I, Gabrielle Vivian-Smith, as delegate of the Minister for Agriculture, being of the reasonable suspicion that the exotic pest pyriform scale exists with Australia but outside Victoria, make the following Order:

1 Objective

The objective of this Order is to prohibit, restrict or impose conditions upon the entry or importation into Victoria of materials which are hosts of pyriform scale.

2 Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 36(1) of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010** (the Act).

3 Commencement

This Order comes into operation on the date of making.

4 Revocation

The Order made under section 36(1) of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**, prohibiting or restricting the entry or importation of pyriform scale host materials into Victoria, and published in Victoria Government Gazette G26 on 30 June 2016 at pages 1604–1605 is **revoked**.

5 Definitions

In this Order –

‘**host plant**’ means any plant or plant product, excluding fruit, seeds and plants in tissue culture, belonging to any of the plant families listed in Schedule 1;

‘**pyriform scale**’ means the exotic pest *Protopulvinaria pyriformis* (Cockerell).

6 Prohibitions, restrictions and conditions

The following prohibitions, restrictions and conditions are specified in relation to the entry or importation of host plants.

- (1) The entry or importation into Victoria of any host plant is prohibited.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the host plant –
 - (a) was grown on or sourced from a property that is located in a State or Territory, or part of a State or Territory, for which an area freedom certificate issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory where the host plant was grown or sourced, is currently in force certifying that the State or Territory or part of the State or Territory is known to be free of pyriform scale; or
 - (b) is accompanied by a plant health certificate, assurance certificate or plant health declaration, certifying or declaring that the host plant has been treated in a manner described in Schedule 2; or
 - (c) enters Victoria under and in accordance with a permit issued by an inspector and there is compliance with any conditions or requirements set out in the permit.

7 Verification

Where requested by an authorised inspector, host plant imported into Victoria, which is required by Clause 6(2) to be accompanied by a certificate or declaration, must be –

- (a) presented to an authorised inspector for inspection; or
- (b) presented for verification by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources.

8 Expiry

This Order remains in force for a period of 12 months after the date of making.

- (a) in the case of potted plants, be treated with a neonicotinoid insecticide registered for the control of scale, at rates specified on the label; or
- (b) in the case of bare rooted deciduous plants, be treated with an organophosphate insecticide registered for the control of scale, at rates specified on the label; and
- (c) be inspected at a minimum of 600 units or the whole consignment, and no pyriform scale detected.

Notes:

Section 38(1) of the Act provides that a person is guilty of an offence and liable for a penalty not exceeding 60 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 300 penalty units in the case of a body corporate, for knowingly causing, permitting or assisting any host material to enter or be imported into Victoria in contravention of an importation order.

Section 38(2) of the Act provides that a person is guilty of an offence and liable for a penalty not exceeding 10 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 60 penalty units in the case of a body corporate, for causing, permitting or assisting any host material to enter or be imported into Victoria in contravention of an importation order.

Terms used in this Order that are defined in the Act have that meaning.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL**Livestock Disease Control Act 1994****EXEMPTION ORDER UNDER SECTION 6(3A)**

Order in Council

The Governor in Council makes the following Order:

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to exempt certain livestock and certain persons from specified provisions of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994** and the Livestock Disease Control Regulations 2017.

2. Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 6(3A) of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994**.

3. Commencement

This order comes into operation on 1 July 2017.

4. Revocation

The Exemption Order under section 6(3A) of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994** made by the Governor in Council on 7 July 2009 and published in Government Gazette G29 on 16 July 2009 at pages 1926–1930 is revoked.

5. Definitions

In this Order –

the Regulations means the Livestock Disease Control Regulations 2017.

6. Exemptions

- (1) An abattoir operator is exempt from the operation of regulation 15 of the Regulations if the slaughter of the livestock is necessary to relieve the livestock from unreasonable pain or suffering.
- (2) A person is exempted from the requirements in Division 1 of Part 5 of the Regulations in relation to the following livestock –
 - a goat that is of the breed Rangeland (feral), Alpine, Anglo Nubian, Australian Brown, British Alpine, Elf, Lamancha, Melaan, Nigerian Dwarf, Saanen or Toggenburg.
- (3) A person is exempted from the requirements in regulation 23 and 24 of the Regulations in respect of sheep and goats introduced into Victoria from interstate provided the sheep or goats are identified by means of an ear tag attached in accordance with any laws relating to identification of livestock of the State or Territory from which the sheep or goat was dispatched and are accompanied by a correctly completed vendor declaration.
- (4) An operator of an abattoir or knackery is exempted from the requirement in regulation 45 of the Regulations in respect of a sheep or goat sourced from a saleyard.
- (5) A person is exempted from the operation of regulation 90(d) in respect of a sheep or a goat sold after 1 July 2017 to the extent of having to provide the unique number encoded in any NLIS device to the operator of an abattoir or knackery.
- (6) A saleyard operator is exempted from the operation of regulation 91 to the extent that it applies to require a record of the unique number encoded in any NLIS device to be made and forwarded to the Secretary or a person nominated by the Secretary in respect of a sheep or goat sold or passed in before 31 March 2018.
- (7) A saleyard operator is exempted from the operation of regulation 91(b) to the extent that it applies to require a record forwarded to the Secretary or person nominated by the Secretary that specifies as deceased any sheep or goat identified by an NLIS tag.

- (8) A saleyard operator is exempted from the operation of regulation 91 in respect of a pig sold or passed in before 1 July 2018.
- (9) An operator of an abattoir or knackery is exempted from the operation of regulation 93 to the extent that it applies to require a record of the unique number encoded in any NLIS device to be made and forwarded to the Secretary or a person nominated by the Secretary in respect of a sheep and a goat identified with an NLIS device if the sheep or goat was sent to the abattoir or knackery (as the case requires) before 1 January 2018.
- (10) A person to whom regulation 94 applies is exempted from the operation of that provision in respect of a sheep and a goat introduced before 31 March 2018 and a pig introduced before 1 July 2018.


