Notice for Recording and Transmitting of Movement Information

- I, Richard Bolt, Secretary to the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources, in accordance with regulations 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 91, 93 and 94 of the Livestock Disease Control Regulations 2017 ('the Regulations') give notice as follows:
- 1. For the purposes of regulations 86, 87, 89, 91, 93 and 94 of the Regulations the person nominated by the Secretary to be notified of the movement information is the administrator of the database system managed by Integrity Systems Company Limited for the purposes of the National Livestock Identification System ('NLIS database system').
- 2. For the purposes of regulations 86 (Cattle scale operator) of the Regulations
 - a. 'the specified manner' means recording the movement information by either electronic means or in a hard copy form, so that the movement information is correlated or cross referenced to each individual head of cattle, sheep or goat; and
 - b. 'the required manner or by the required method of transmission' means accessing the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site at www.nlis.com.au and sending the movement information in a form capable of being received and downloaded into the NLIS database system.
- 3. For the purposes of regulations 87 (Auctioneer or selling agent of cattle, sheep and goats not sold from saleyard) and 90 (Auctioneer or selling agent of pigs, sheep and goats sold at saleyard) of the Regulations
 - a. 'the specified manner' means recording the movement information by electronic means, so that the movement information is correlated or cross referenced to each individual pig, sheep or goat; and
 - b. 'the required manner' means accessing the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site at www.nlis.com.au and sending the movement information in a form capable of being received and downloaded into the NLIS database system.
- 4. For the purposes of regulation 88 (Auctioneer or selling agent of cattle sold at saleyard)
 - a. 'the required manner' means the manner determined by the saleyard operator operating
 at the saleyard at which the cattle was sold and notified to the auctioneer or selling
 agent; and
 - b. 'the manner required by the Secretary' means via email or fax to an email address or fax number nominated by the abattoir or knackery.

- 5. For the purposes of regulations 89 (Saleyard operator to record information about cattle and forward it to Secretary) and 91 (Saleyard operator to record information about pigs, sheep and goats and forward it to Secretary) of the Regulations
 - a. 'the specified manner' means recording the movement information by electronic means, so that the movement information is correlated or cross referenced to each individual head of cattle, pig, sheep or goat; and
 - b. 'the required manner or by required method of transmission' means accessing the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site at www.nlis.com.au and sending the movement information in a form capable of being received and downloaded into the NLIS database system.
- 6. For the purposes of regulation 93 (Operator of an abattoir or knackery), the 'required manner' of forwarding movement information is by accessing the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site at www.nlis.com.au and sending the movement information in a form capable of being received and downloaded into the NLIS database system.
- 7. For the purposes of regulation 94 (Livestock owner) of the Regulations
 - a. 'the required manner or by the required method of transmission' means recording the movement information is by electronic means so that the movement information is correlated or cross referenced to each individual head of cattle, pig, sheep or goat; and
 - b. 'the required manner or by the required method of transmission' is
 - by accessing the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site located at www.nlis.com.au and sending the movement information electronically to the NLIS database system through the NLIS internet site in a form capable of being received and downloaded into the NLIS database system; or
 - ii. electronically via email.
- 8. This Notice takes effect on the day that it is published in the Government Gazette.
- 9. The Notice for Recording and Transmitting of Movement Information published in Victoria Government Gazette S134 on 21 June 2007 is revoked.
- 10. Section 94A of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994** requires that records be available for inspection for a period of 7 years after the date of the sale or purchase.
