 - (iii) Studio Park, McClelland Drive, Langwarrin;

 - (v) Paratea Reserve, Paratea Avenue, Frankston; and
 - (vi) George Pentland Botanic Gardens, Williams Street, Frankston.
- (c) Cats are prohibited from the total area of the following reserves:
- (i) Seaford Wetlands, Austin Road, Seaford;
 - (ii) Seaford Foreshore Reserve, Nepean Highway, Seaford;
 - (iii) Sweetwater Reserve, Nepean Highway, Frankston;
 - (iv) Kananook Reserve, Nepean Highway, Seaford; and
 - (v) Pines Forest Flora and Fauna Reserve, Frankston.

3. Dog owner's obligations

- (a) A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a 'Designated Reserve' if the owner:
- (i) carries a chain, cord or leash sufficient to bring the dog under control if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal;
 - (ii) remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog so as to be able to promptly bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash if that becomes necessary; and
 - (iii) does not allow the dog to chase, rush at, bite or attack any person or animal.
- (b) If the dog is off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve, the dog must be brought under effective control of the owner by means of a chain, cord or leash if the dog is within 10 metres of:
- (i) the principal location of an organised sporting event;
 - (ii) a children's play equipment area when play equipment is in use; or
 - (iii) a permanent barbecue or picnic area.

HUMAN RIGHTS LIST EXEMPTION

Application No. H48/2021

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the Act) by YWCA Housing (the Applicant). The Applicant sought an exemption to allow it to undertake the following activities without contravening the Act:

- (a) to preference women (including to preference women aged 55 and over and women who are working or on low income) in considering future

applications (including applications from existing residents other than those seeking a transfer application due to issues with their accommodation beyond their control relating to their safety, significant repairs or that makes their accommodation no longer tenable) for vacancies which arise in the YWCA Housing portfolio; and

- (b) to preference women (including to preference women aged 55 and over and women who are working or on low income) in providing access to the Pathways to Independence Program, a program which provides information on housing pathways, including referrals to essential services, and support through brokerage such as rental subsidies, removalists costs, and other vital expenses (the PTI Services).

For the reasons published today, the Tribunal found that much of the activities outlined in the application came under sections 60 and 88 of the Act, and therefore an exemption was unnecessary for those activities.

For the reasons published today, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from sections 52, 53, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the Applicant to preference women aged 55 and over, in considering future applications (including applications from existing residents other than those seeking a transfer application due to issues with their accommodation beyond their control relating to their safety, significant repairs or that makes their accommodation no longer tenable) for vacancies which arise in the YWCA Housing portfolio (the exempt conduct).

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption from the operation of sections 52, 53, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the Applicant to undertake the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 16 December 2024.
