NOTICE CONTROLLING NAVIGATION IN THE VICINITY OF WORKS

Parks Victoria, as the declared waterway manager for the waters of the Yarra River upstream of the port waters of the Port of Melbourne, makes the following notice under section 211(1)(b)(i) of the Marine Safety Act 2010 (the Act).

For the purposes of the works activity proposed by Australasian Marine Associates to undertake maintenance dredging of the Lower Yarra River, this notice supersedes and amends the previous notices published in the Victoria Government Gazette S 146 on Friday 25 March 2022 and S 275 on Thursday 2 June 2022.

The navigation and movement of vessels is prohibited on the waters of the Yarra River as detailed below in Table 1, excluding vessels involved in the works and Parks Victoria vessels.

Southgate Floating Landings (including Princes Bridge) Monday 29 August to Monday 12 September 2022	Downstream of Even Walker bridge to upstream end of Southgate floating landings. An exclusion zone of approximately 280 m long and 30 m wide from the southern bank will be established as marked by buoys and signage. The exclusion zone may move as required within the area. Northern arch of Princes Bridge closed to unpowered vessel traffic.	Maintenance dredging to reinstate functional depth. Increased berthing and motorised vessel activity at Federation Wharf and through the northern arch of Princes Bridge due to displaced berth license holders.	Open. Approximately 40 m wide transit lane from the northern bank. Middle arch and southern arch of Princes Bridge open to all vessels.

World Trade Centre Landing Friday 9 September to Tuesday 20 September 2022	Downstream of Spencer Street Bridge, outside of World Trade Centre Landing. An exclusion zone of approximately 230 m long and 35 m wide from the northern bank will be established as marked by buoys and signage. The exclusion zone may move as required within the area.	Maintenance dredging to reinstate functional depth.	Open. Approximately 40 m wide transit lane from the southern bank.
Southbank Floating Landing and Sandridge Wharf Wednesday 21 September to Tuesday 11 October 2022	Downstream of Queen Street Bridge to upstream of Even Walker Bridge. An exclusion zone of approximately 400 m long and 35 m wide from the southern bank will be established as marked by buoys and signage. The exclusion zone may move as required within the area.	Maintenance dredging to reinstate functional depth.	Open. Approximately 45 m wide transit lane from the northern bank.

Princes Bridge Southern Arch Wednesday 12 October to Sunday 23 November 2022	Entirety of southern arch of Princes bridge and 90 m downstream and 140 m upstream. An exclusion zone of approximately 250 m long and 35 m wide from the southern bank will be established as marked by buoys and signage. The exclusion zone may move as required within the area.	Maintenance dredging to reinstate functional depth.	Open. Approximately 60 m wide transit lane from the northern bank.
Disposal Site Monday 29 August to Sunday 23 November 2022	Upstream of Bolte Bridge on northern and southern banks. Exclusion zones of approximately 50 m long and 45 m wide from either the northern or southern banks will be established as marked by buoys and signage. The exclusion zone may move as required within the area.	Discharge of dredge material.	Open. Approximately 80 m wide central transit lane.

The exclusion zones will be marked by stringline buoyage, lit water communication buoys fitted with 1–2 nm marine lanterns and lit warning signage on approach from both upstream and downstream.

Times and dates are subject to change. Changes to times, durations or days will be advertised on Parks Victoria's website and Notice to River Users.

This notice has effect from 7.00 am on 29 August 2022 to 5.00 pm on 23 November 2022. Dated 29 August 2022
