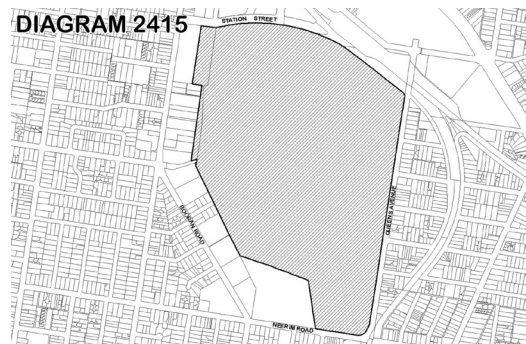

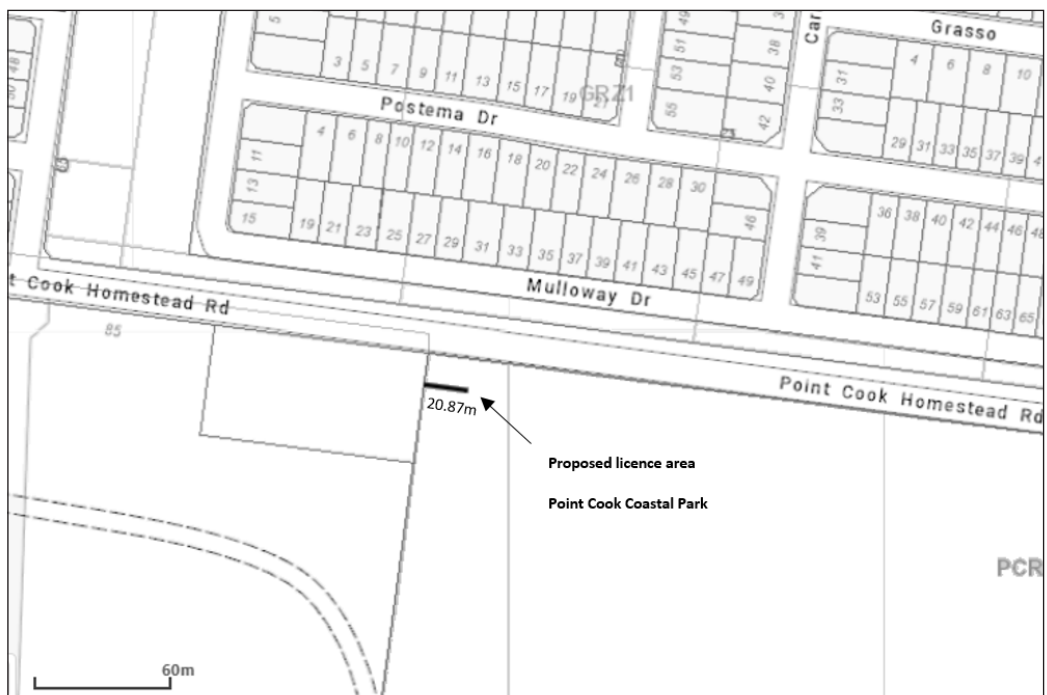

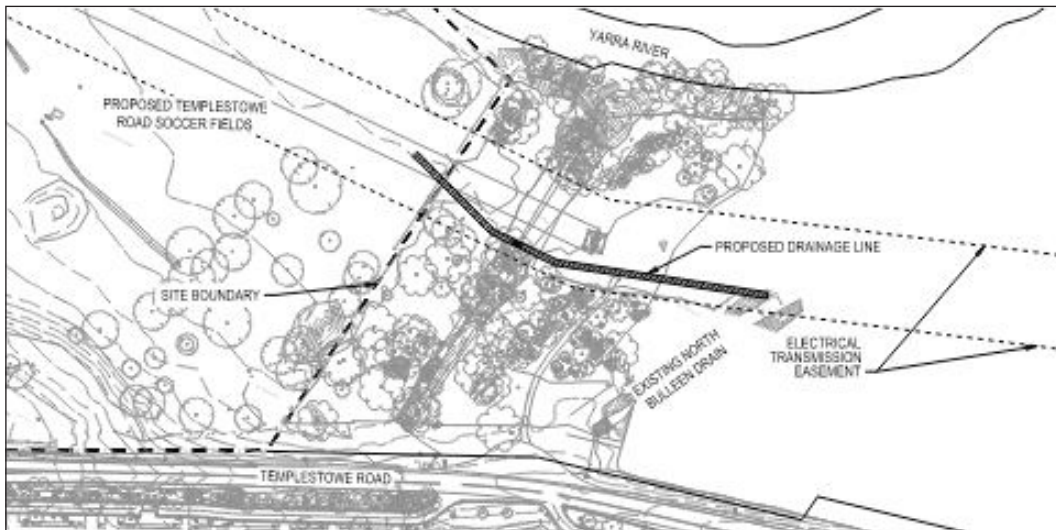

NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

Proposed Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Amendment Regulations 2023

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994** that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the proposed Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Amendment Regulations 2023 (the proposed Regulations).

The proposed Regulations, to be made under the **Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Act 1981** (the Act), prescribe certain matters needed to implement parts of the Act concerning the regulation of the monitored poisons database (SafeScript).

The objectives of the proposed Regulations are to add three new medicines to be monitored in the monitored poisons database (SafeScript) – pregabalin, gabapentin and tramadol and to be monitored supply poisons. The effect of this is that registered medical practitioners, nurse practitioners and pharmacists will be required to check the monitored poisons database (SafeScript) prior to prescribing or supplying pregabalin, gabapentin and tramadol.

The reason for the proposed Regulations is that there is substantial evidence of harms caused by pregabalin, gabapentin and tramadol to warrant their inclusion in the monitored poisons database (SafeScript).

The RIS presents the cost to prescribers and pharmacists implementing the proposed Regulations and the expected health, social and financial benefits. The results of the RIS show that the preferred option is to include pregabalin, gabapentin and tramadol in the monitored poisons database as opposed to not making any additions or only including pregabalin and gabapentin. This preferred option has the greatest benefit to cost ratio and net present value.
