**HUMAN RIGHTS LIST
EXEMPTION**

Application No. H392/2022

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the Act) by Women's Health Grampians (the applicant). The applicant varied its initial application and now seeks an exemption to enable it to: employ females only; provide services, including membership-related services, to females only; and advertise these matters (the exempt conduct).

Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the affidavit of Marianne Hendron, CEO of the applicant, and the

written submissions providing information about the applicant, its programs, structure, policies and staff positions, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from sections 16, 44, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

In granting this exemption the Tribunal noted:

- The applicant is one of nine regional and three state-wide women's health services funded by the Victorian Department of Health. The applicant is a not-for-profit community organisation run by women for women. The applicant's constitution defines woman and women as inclusive of females and people who identify as female.
- The applicant aims to improve women's equality, health and wellbeing in the Grampians region and beyond. They work closely with all levels of government, community and business to achieve better public policy and services for women and to work towards achieving gender equality. Their key areas of work include violence against women, sexual and reproductive health, gender equality, and programmes with First Nations, migrant and refugee women.
- The applicant's programs actively involve and empower women in seeking choice, responsibility and control over their own health and access to sensitive healthcare options, recognising a woman's whole life span and various roles. Women often contact the applicant requesting information about local family and domestic violence services, sexual and reproduction health options, general advice about sensitive situations such as unplanned pregnancies, contraception, and personal safety. The applicant also provides training and information sessions, where women also disclose personal sensitive situations to the applicant's employees and request information about local services. The applicant seeks to create an environment that is accessible, nonthreatening, comfortable, and where confidentiality and respect for women's perspective is attributed the highest priority.

- The applicant currently employs three full-time and 20 part-time employees in health promotion and disease prevention, prevention of violence against women, sexual and reproductive health, First Nations health equality, migrant and refugee health, research and evaluation, and administration. The size of the organisation means all staff have some level of client contact. While not all positions are focused on direct client service delivery, all staff have some client contact and stakeholder engagement. All staff support clients who visit the offices or through outreach programs and over the telephone. The applicant believes the involvement of men in sensitive areas relating to women's health can be counterproductive and may exclude some women from access to their services. Women accessing the services may feel threatened or less open to discussing issues that affect their health and wellbeing such as reproductive rights, economic abuse, and domestic violence issues. Research referred to by the applicant indicates one in four women have unintended pregnancies, with rural women 1.4 times more likely to experience unintended pregnancies. Local and regional data indicates major barriers for rural women accessing family planning services, and current services are unable to meet current demand for services providing sexual and reproduction health options, and advice about sensitive matters such as unplanned pregnancies, contraception, and personal safety.
- The Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission was notified of the application and indicated it did not seek leave to intervene.
- The applicant was granted an exemption in respect of similar conduct in 2017. While some of the applicant's services may be characterised as special services for special needs as set out in section 88 of the Act, and some of the staff positions may come under the exception in section 28 of the Act, the Tribunal is not satisfied that all the staff positions and services would come under those exceptions. Therefore, in the absence of an exemption, the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination. Given the size of the organisation requires all staff to have some level of client contact, and

the vulnerability and special needs of some of its clients, the Tribunal accepts that the services provided by the applicant are most effectively delivered by an organisation that employs women only providing services to women only.

- When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (the Charter). The Tribunal has considered all the relevant factors including the nature of the right, the importance of the purpose of the limitation, the nature and extent of the limitation, and the relationship between the limitation and its purpose, and any less restrictive means reasonably available to achieve the purpose the limitation seeks to achieve. This exemption limits the right to equality, and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination for people who do not identify as women, who may wish to be employed by, or seek the services of, the applicant. The Tribunal considers the exempt conduct is focused and directed to delivering the applicant's purpose, and that the exemption will not adversely affect anyone seeking employment or services from other organisations. On the evidence before it, the Tribunal is satisfied that, in the circumstances discussed above, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.
- Based on the evidence and considerations noted above, the Tribunal is satisfied in all the relevant circumstances of the case, that it is appropriate to grant the exemption.
- The Tribunal is also satisfied that the exemption should be granted for the period of five years.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption from the operation of sections 16, 44, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 13 April 2028.
