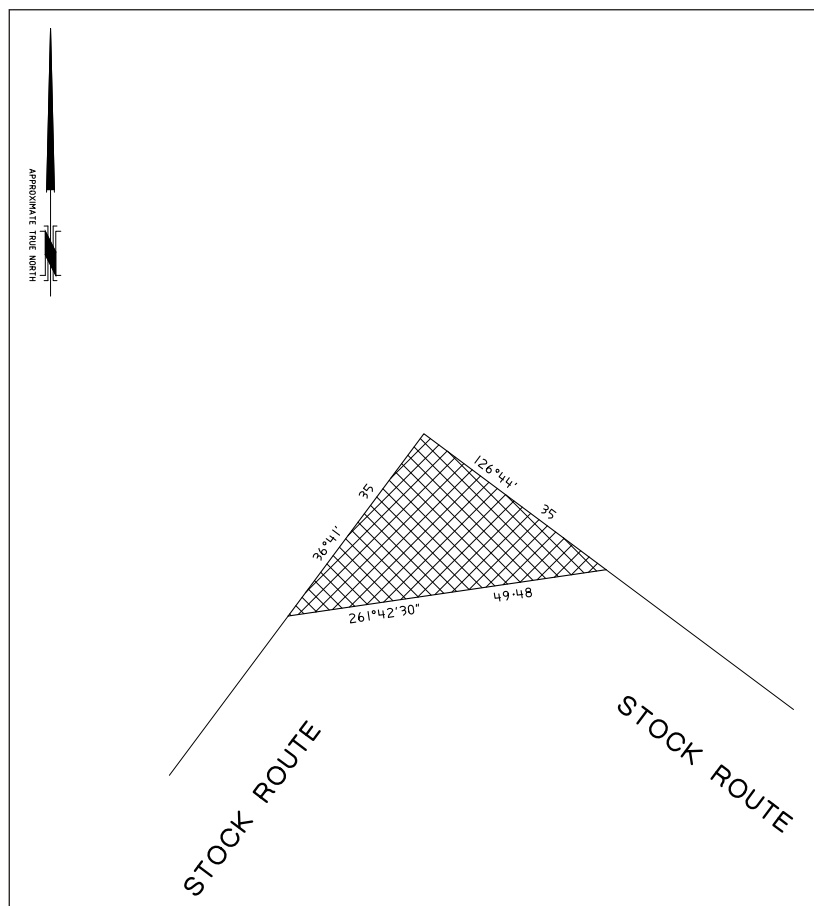

ROAD DISCONTINUANCE

Pursuant to section 206 and Schedule 10, Clause 3 of the **Local Government Act 1989**, the Towong Shire Council at its meeting held on 29 March 2023 resolved to discontinue part of the Stock Route in Corryong, being part of the road 1 on Title Plan TP329264S and contained within Certificate of Title Volume 8159 Folio 434, shown hatched on the plan below, and to sell the land from the discontinued road by private treaty to the abutting property owner.

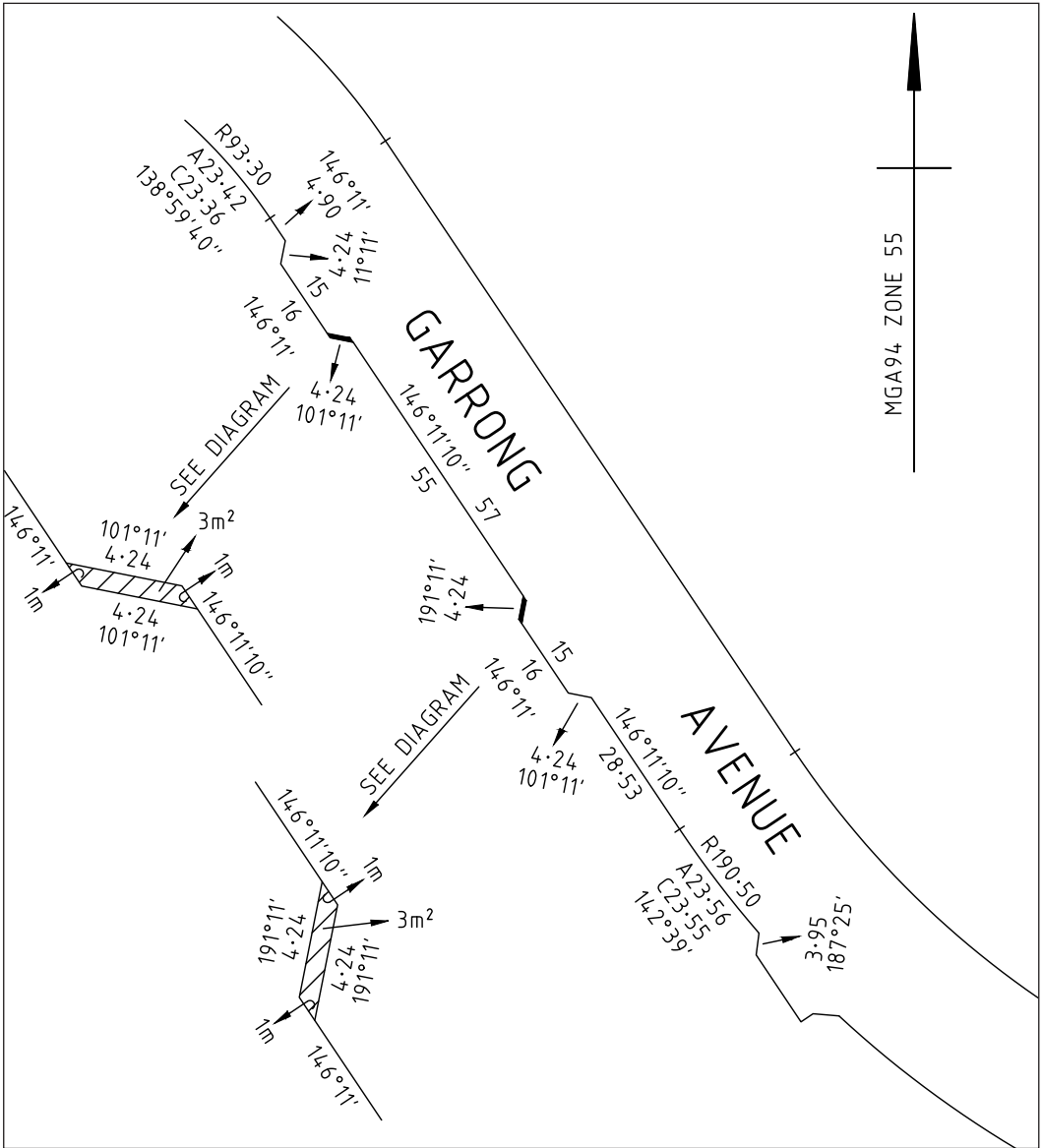

Domestic Animals Act 1994

The Council in the exercise of its powers under section 26 of the **Domestic Animals Act 1994** resolved that from the date of the publication of this Order that:

1. General Matters

- a. The owner of any dog must keep the dog under effective control by means of a leash or chain when they are in a public place in the municipal district, except where signs designate an area as being available for unleashed dogs.
- b. Dogs are not permitted on any beach in the municipal district between the hours of 9.00 am and 8.00 pm each day from the period from the first day of December until the last day of February in any year.

2. Exceptions and obligations

Despite Clause 1 (b), dogs may be exercised off leash at the Narrows Beach provided that an owner has the dog under the effective control at all times and provided –

- a. the dog remains under effective control by either voice or hand commands and the dog remains within sight of the owner so that it can be immediately brought back under control by placing it on a leash or chain if it becomes necessary to prevent the dog wandering out of effective control or to avoid any intimidating behaviour or threatening attack; and
- b. the owner does not allow the dog to worry or threaten any person or animal and does not allow the dog to attack any person or animal.

3. Interpretation for the purposes of this Order:

- a. 'Public Place' has the same meaning as the **Summary Offences Act 1966**.
- b. 'Owner' has the same meaning as in the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**.
- c. Narrows Beach is the beach that is adjacent to the area described as Dog Beach carpark (also known as Narrows Beach carpark) in the Narrows, between Point Lonsdale and Queenscliff. The Narrows Beach extends from the end of the rock sea wall eastwards to a boundary which is approximately level with the west end of Fraser Street, Queenscliff to the low water mark.

The applicant varied its initial application and now seeks an exemption to enable it to advertise for and only employ staff that are physically or physiologically female, or whose gender identity is female (women) or non-binary (the exempt conduct).

Upon reading the material filed in this application, including the affidavits and oral evidence of Dale Wakefield, CEO of the applicant, the written submissions provided by the applicant, and the written submission received by the Tribunal in response to the notice of the application, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from sections 16, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

In granting this exemption the Tribunal noted:

- The applicant is a family violence support service based in Melbourne's western metropolitan area. It delivers community support programs and advocacy-based work to promote equal rights and the prevention of family violence. Prior to September 2021, the applicant was known as Women's Health West Inc.
- The applicant provides a number of family violence support services including responding to police and hospital referrals, risk assessments, court support, crisis housing, case management and counselling. These services are primarily provided to women and children experiencing family violence. In 2020–21, the applicant received 13,667 family violence referrals from police. Ninety-six percent of the applicant's clients are women and girls. The applicant has recently identified the unmet need for support for people identifying as non-binary experiencing family violence, and has adapted its service provision accordingly. Some limited services are also provided to men affected by family violence and through the Orange Door program. The applicant also provides training to local councils in relation to compliance with the

Gender Equality Act 2020. The applicant provides training about preventing men's violence, promoting sexual and reproductive health, health education, and mental health and wellbeing training. Client feedback and experience indicates that the applicant's services, training, advocacy and leadership are most effective when undertaken by people with lived experience.

- In compliance with directions from the Tribunal, a notice of the application inviting submissions for or against the application was published in a local area newspaper, on the applicant's website, sent to all its employees and relevant unions, and to all members. One response was received by the Tribunal. That response raised concerns about reliance on self-identification and the risk to vulnerable women accessing the service.
- Previous exemptions were granted to the applicant in 2000, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2012 and 2017. The current application seeks a more limited exemption because of the recent changes to the organisation, its membership criteria and client categories.
- The Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission was notified of the application and indicated it did not seek leave to intervene.
- A majority of the applicant's staff work in direct client services and community training, advocacy and engagement. While most of the applicant's services may be characterised as special services for special needs as set out in section 88 of the Act, and most of the staff positions may come under the exception in section 28 of the Act, the Tribunal is not satisfied that all the applicant's staff positions would come under those exceptions. Therefore, in the absence of an exemption, the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination. Given the nature of the services provided, the vulnerability and special needs of many of its clients, and the high proportion of clients continuing to be women and girls, the Tribunal accepts that the services provided by the applicant are most effectively delivered by an organisation that employs only staff that are physically or physiologically female, or whose gender identity is female (women) or non-binary.

- When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (the Charter). The Tribunal has considered all the relevant factors including the nature of the right, the importance of the purpose of the limitation, the nature and extent of the limitation, the relationship between the limitation and its purpose, and any less restrictive means reasonably available to achieve the purpose the limitation seeks to achieve. This exemption limits the right to equality and privacy, and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination for people who do not identify as women or non-binary, who wish to be employed by the applicant. While the Tribunal has taken into consideration the response received by the Tribunal raising concerns about self-identification, the Tribunal considers any such risks can be managed by the applicant. The Tribunal considers the exempt conduct is focused and directed to delivering the applicant's purpose, and that the exemption will not adversely affect anyone seeking employment or services from other organisations. On the evidence before it, the Tribunal is satisfied that, in the circumstances discussed above, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.
- Based on the evidence and considerations noted above, the Tribunal is satisfied in all the relevant circumstances of the case, that it is appropriate to grant the exemption.
- The applicant has requested an exemption for a period of two years and the Tribunal is satisfied that the exemption should be granted for that period.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption from the operation of sections 16, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 4 May 2025.

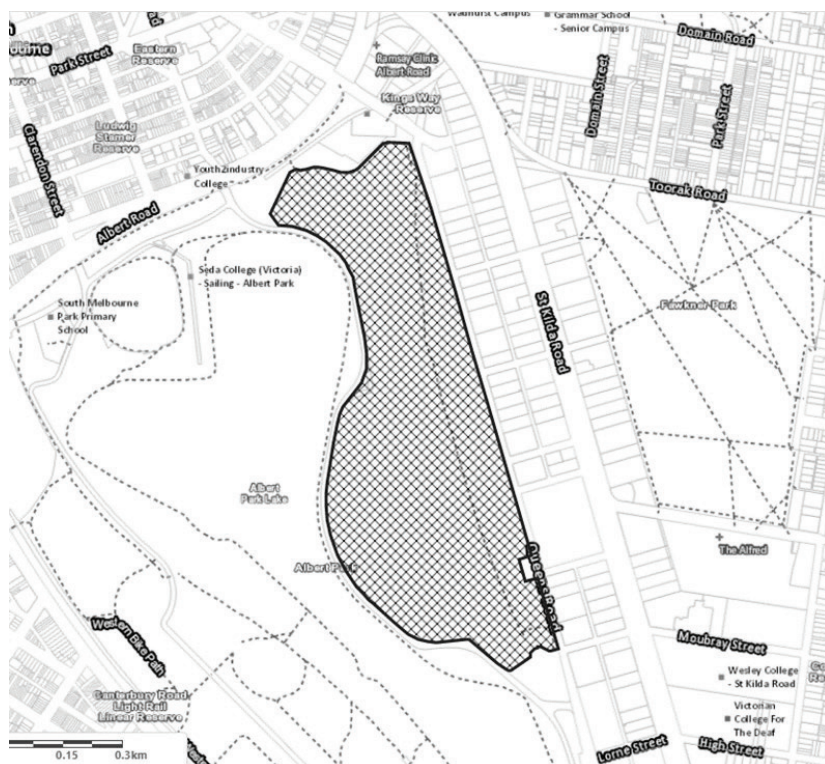

REGULATION 86(1)(a) OF THE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION REGULATIONS 2021****Classification of Lead-Acid Batteries****1. Citation**

This designation is 01 of 2023 and may be cited as: EPA Designation – Classification of lead-acid batteries.

2. Authority to issue designation

This designation is issued by the Environment Protection Authority (the Authority) under regulation 86(1)(a) of the Environment Protection Regulations 2021 (the Regulations). The Regulations are made under the **Environment Protection Act 2017** (the Act).

Lead-acid batteries that are industrial waste are classified as reportable priority waste at item 18 of the Table in Schedule 5 to the Regulations, being ‘Lead and lead based compounds’ (waste code D220).

The Authority is satisfied that, if it did not issue this designation, the classification of lead-acid batteries to which this designation applies as reportable priority waste would impose an undue burden on persons in management or control of that waste.

The Authority is further satisfied that management of lead-acid batteries to which this designation applies, in accordance with this designation (including the conditions set out below), will not pose a serious risk of harm to human health or the environment.

3. Definitions

In this designation, words or phrases have the same meaning as in the Act or the Regulations, and –

battery electrolyte means the electrolyte of sulfuric acid contained in lead-acid batteries;

lead-acid battery means a battery with positive and negative electrodes containing lead submerged in electrolyte of sulfuric acid.

4. Application

(1) Subject to subclause (2), this designation applies to lead-acid batteries that are industrial waste in the following circumstances –

(a) transporting lead-acid batteries if –

- (i) the aggregate volume of battery electrolyte in the lead-acid batteries being transported on a vehicle is not more than 1,000 litres; or
- (ii) if the aggregate volume of battery electrolyte in the lead-acid batteries is not known, the aggregate mass of lead-acid batteries being transported on a vehicle is not more than 4 tonnes.

(b) receiving or storing lead-acid batteries if –

- (i) the aggregate volume of battery electrolyte in the lead-acid batteries being stored at a place or premises is not more than 10,000 litres; or
- (ii) if the aggregate volume of battery electrolyte in the batteries is not known, the aggregate mass of lead-acid batteries being stored at a place or premises is not more than 40 tonnes.

(2) This designation does not apply to a place or premises at which lead-acid batteries are treated, processed, dismantled or drained.

5. Classification

Lead-acid batteries to which this designation applies are classified as –

- (a) not priority waste, in the circumstances of the storage of not more than 5 m³ of lead-acid batteries; and
- (b) priority waste (but not reportable priority waste), in all other circumstances.

6. Conditions

This designation is subject to the following conditions –

- (a) a person transporting lead-acid batteries must take all reasonable steps to ensure that –
 - (i) lead-acid batteries are packed and loaded for transport so that battery terminals do not support the weight of other superimposed elements; and
 - (ii) where lead-acid batteries are packed or loaded for transport in tiers, each tier is separated by a layer of electrically non-conductive material; and
 - (iii) when packing, loading or transporting lead-acid batteries –
 - (A) battery electrolyte is prevented from escaping lead-acid batteries; and
 - (B) any leaks, spills or any other discharge of battery electrolyte or waste from lead-acid batteries are contained and cleaned up; and
 - (C) lead-acid batteries are protected against short circuits; and
 - (iv) battery cables and connections from lead-acid batteries are removed prior to packing or loading for transport other than cables connecting lead-acid batteries together; and
 - (v) lead-acid batteries are packed and loaded for transport separate from incompatible materials and other types of batteries; and
 - (vi) prior to packing or loading lead-acid batteries for transport, any leaking lead-acid batteries are isolated; and
 - (vii) leaking lead-acid batteries are disposed of as soon as reasonably practicable; and
 - (viii) where lead-acid batteries are packed or loaded for transport in containers, the containers are resistant to battery electrolyte.
- (b) a person in management or control of the place or premises at which lead-acid batteries are received or stored must ensure that –
 - (i) lead-acid batteries are stored on a hardstand or equivalent impermeable surface and under cover; and
 - (ii) lead-acid batteries are stored so that battery terminals do not support the weight of other superimposed elements; and
 - (iii) where lead-acid batteries are stored in tiers, each tier is separated by a layer of electrically non-conductive material; and
 - (iv) when handling or storing lead-acid batteries, all reasonable steps are taken to –
 - (A) prevent battery electrolyte escaping lead-acid batteries; and
 - (B) prevent leaks, spills or any other discharge of battery electrolyte entering the environment; and
 - (C) contain and clean up any leaks, spills or any other discharge of battery electrolyte or waste from lead-acid batteries; and
 - (D) protect stored lead-acid batteries against short circuits; and
 - (v) battery cables and connections are removed from lead-acid batteries prior to storage, other than cables connecting lead-acid batteries together; and
 - (vi) lead-acid batteries are stored separate from incompatible materials and other types of batteries; and
 - (vii) prior to storing, transporting or disposing of lead-acid batteries, any leaking lead-acid batteries are isolated; and
 - (viii) leaking lead-acid batteries are disposed of as soon as reasonably practicable; and
 - (ix) where lead-acid batteries are stored in containers, the containers are resistant to battery electrolyte; and

- (x) records are kept of –
 - (A) incoming and outgoing movements of lead-acid batteries; and
 - (B) the current location where lead-acid batteries are stored at the place or premises; and
- (xi) the records set out in subparagraph (x) are retained for at least two years; and
- (xii) the records set out in subparagraph (x) are made available for inspection by the Authority on request.

7. Duration

This designation comes into operation on 4 May 2023.

8. Notes

Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING THE ENTRY OR IMPORTATION INTO VICTORIA OF MATERIALS WHICH ARE HOSTS OF ELECTRIC ANT**

I, Rosa Crnov, as delegate of the Minister for Agriculture, being of the reasonable suspicion that the exotic pest electric ant exists within Australia but outside Victoria, make the following Order.

1 Objective

The objective of this Order is to prohibit, restrict or impose conditions upon the entry or importation into Victoria of materials which are hosts of electric ant.

2 Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 36(1) of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**.

3 Commencement

This Order comes into force on the day of making.

4 Revocation

The Order entitled *Order prohibiting or restricting the entry or importation into Victoria of materials which are hosts of electric ant* made under section 36(1) of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**, and published in Victoria Government Gazette G31 on 4 August 2022 at pages 3310–3312 is **revoked**.

5 Definitions

In this Order –

electric ant means the exotic pest *Wasmannia auropunctata* Rogers.

host material means any material capable of harbouring electric ants including plants, plant products, agricultural equipment, used packages, earth and landscaping materials (including potting media, organic mulch and composted animal manure), but excludes tissue culture, bare rooted plants washed free of earth material and seedlings in plugs/cells.

6 Prohibitions, restrictions and conditions

The following prohibitions, restrictions and conditions are specified in relation to the entry or importation of host material.

- (a) The entry or importation into Victoria of any host material is prohibited.
- (b) Sub-clause (a) does not apply if the electric ant host material –
 - (i) originates from an area for which there is currently in force an area freedom certificate, being a certificate issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory from which the host material originated, certifying that the area from which the host material originated is known to be free of electric ant; or
 - (ii) is accompanied by a plant health certificate, assurance certificate or plant health declaration, certifying or declaring that the material has been tested or treated in a manner prescribed in the Schedule to this Order; or
 - (iii) enters Victoria under and in accordance with a permit issued by an inspector and there is compliance with any conditions or requirements set out in the permit.

7 Verification of Consignments

Where requested by an inspector, host material imported into Victoria which is required by clause 6(b)(ii) to be accompanied by a certificate or declaration, must be –

- (a) presented to an Inspector for inspection; or
- (b) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action.

8 Expiry

This Order remains in force for a period of 12 months from the day of making.

Schedule

Host material must –

- (1) in the case of plants or plant products, be grown in media treated with one of the following chemicals in accordance with the approved APVMA label or permit –
 - (a) a liquid mixture containing 80 g/L bifenthrin applied at 2.5 mL/L water as full immersion dip or drench, and plants consigned within 28 days; or
 - (b) a liquid mixture containing 500 g/L chlorpyrifos applied at 40 mL/100L by drenching of the growing medium, and plants consigned within 28 days; or
 - (c) a 2 g/kg bifenthrin granular insecticide thoroughly blended at 10 ppm, and plants consigned within 6 months; or
 - (d) a 2 g/kg bifenthrin granular insecticide thoroughly blended at 12 ppm, and plants consigned within 12 months; or
 - (e) a 2 g/kg bifenthrin granular insecticide thoroughly blended at 15 ppm, and plants consigned within 24 months; and; or
 - (f) a 100 g/kg chlorpyrifos granular insecticide at 1 kg/m³ of growing media, and plants consigned within 12 months; and
 - (g) stored, handled and consigned in such a manner that would prevent infestation of electric ants, or
- (2) in the case of hay and straw, be –
 - (a) treated by fumigation with a product containing 1000 g/kg methyl bromide at a rate of 48 g/m³ at 21°C for at least 24 hours; and
 - (b) stored, handled and consigned after treatment so as to prevent infestation with electric ants; and
 - (c) inspected and found to be dry and free of earth material and electric ants; and
 - (d) dispatched within 28 days of treatment; or
- (3) in the case of turf, be –
 - (a) treated by cover spraying, at least 48 hours before lifting, with a solution of containing 500 g/L of chlorpyrifos applied at the rate of 2 L/ha; and
 - (b) dispatched within 28 days of treatment; and
 - (c) stored, handled and consigned after harvesting so as to prevent infestation with electric ants; or
- (4) in the case of agricultural equipment and used packages, be –
 - (a) cleaned free of earth material and organic matter by –
 - (i) brushing; or
 - (ii) high pressure water; or
 - (iii) steam; and
 - (b) inspected and found free of earth material, organic matter and electric ants; or
- (5) in the case of earth material and landscaping materials –
 - (a) be treated by –
 - (i) heating the entire mass to a minimum temperature of 65.5°C using steam or dry heat; or
 - (ii) fumigating with a product containing 1000 g/kg methyl bromide, at the rate of 48 g/m³ at 21°C for at least 24 hours; or
 - (iii) in the case of diagnostic samples, freezing to at least –20°C for not less than 24 hours; and

- (b) be produced, stored, handled and consigned in such a manner that would prevent infestation or destroy all life stages of electric ants; and
- (c) remain packed in the original sealed bag or container in which it was first commercially packed.
