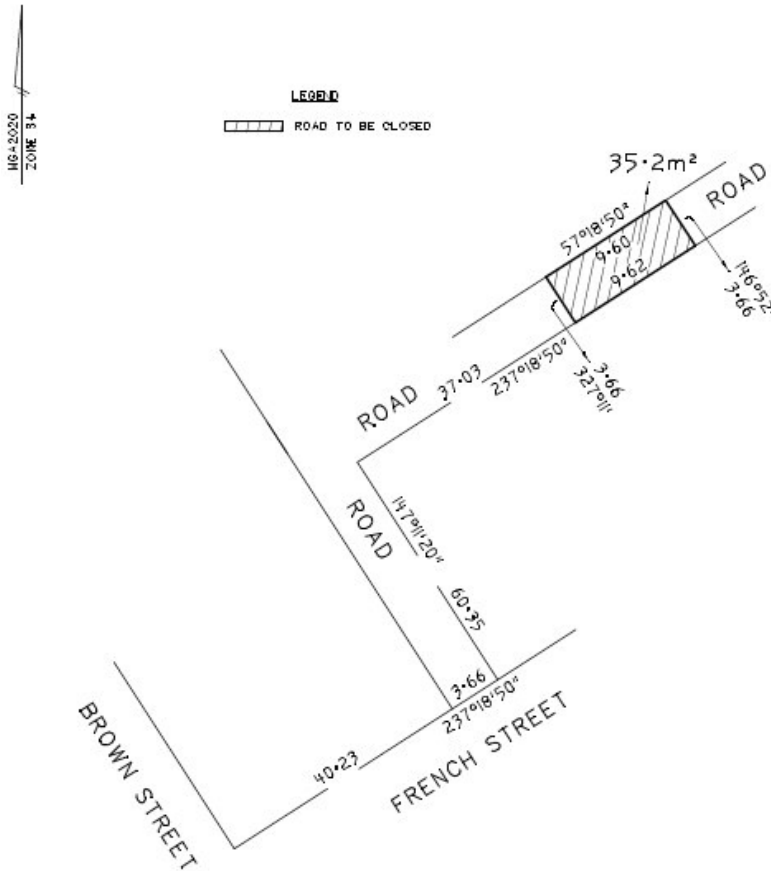

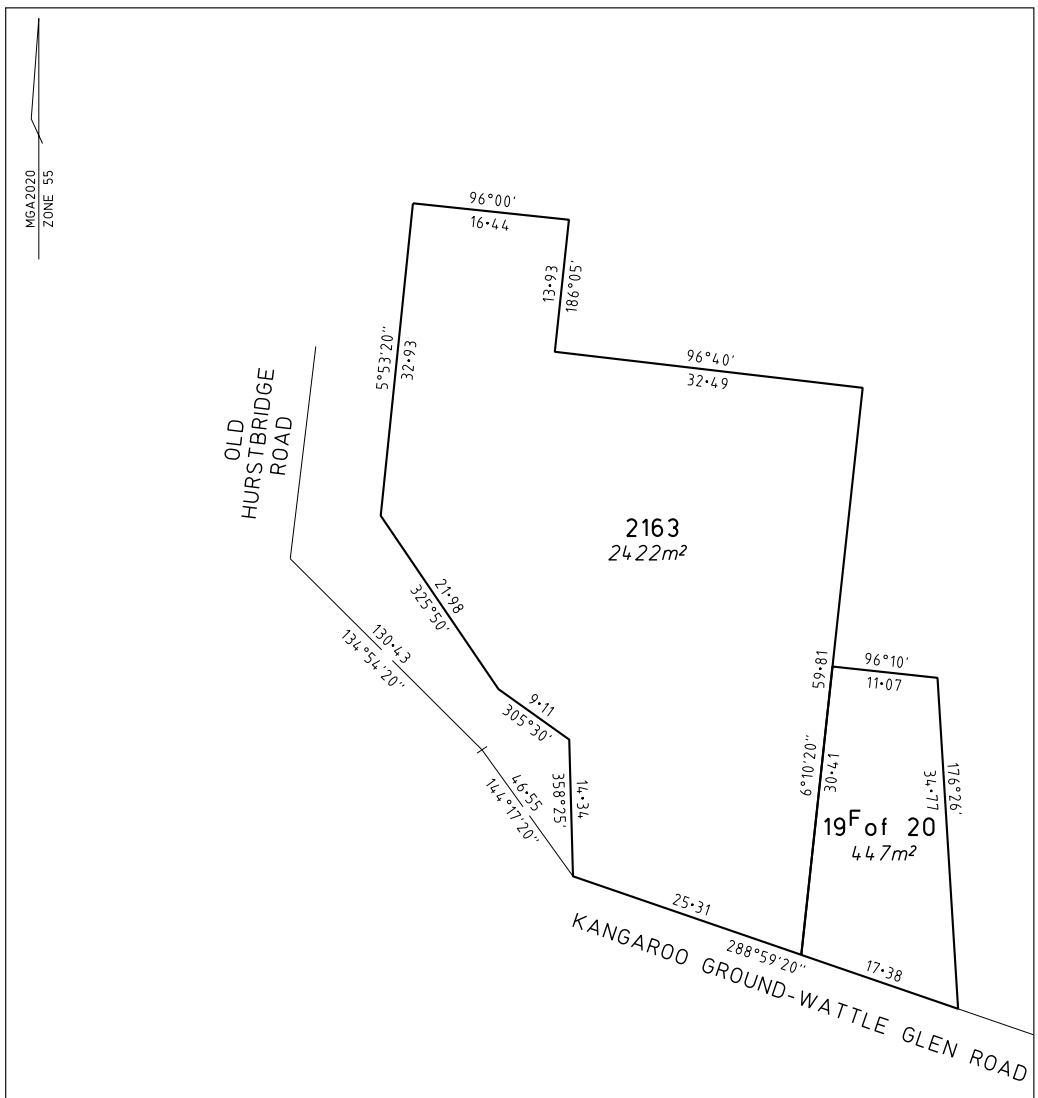

## Essential Services Commission Act 2001

Notice of Inquiry: Port of Melbourne – Market Rent Inquiry 2024–2025

The **Port Management Act 1995** (the Act) establishes the economic regulatory framework for Victoria's commercial ports.

### Purpose of inquiry

The Essential Services Commission (the commission) is to conduct an inquiry under section 53 of the Act in which it will consider whether the Port of Melbourne (a private operator):

- has power it may exercise in the process for setting and reviewing rents for land at the Port of Melbourne
- has exercised that power in a way that causes material detriment to Victorian consumers (a misuse of market power).

If the commission finds that there has been a misuse of market power, the commission must make recommendations to the Assistant Treasurer about possible economic regulation.

The inquiry covers land rents set and reviewed during the five year inquiry period from 1 November 2019 to 31 October 2024. The inquiry is to be conducted in accordance with Part 5 of the **Essential Services Commission Act 2001**.

### Matters to be had regard to

In undertaking the inquiry, the commission must have regard to:

- processes used by the Port of Melbourne to set and review land rents
- compliance with any processes required under any agreements or arrangements entered into by the Port of Melbourne in connection with the lease of land at the port
- extent to which the land rents paid by tenants are ultimately passed through to Victorian consumers.

### Period of inquiry

This inquiry will be conducted from the date of publication of this notice to the end of April 2025. The commission must provide a final inquiry report with recommendations to the Assistant Treasurer by 30 April 2025.

### Contributing to the inquiry

An inquiry scope and process paper is available on the commission website. Written submissions in response to this paper should be made by 5.00 pm 14 November 2024.

Stakeholders can schedule a confidential drop-in session with commission staff during November 2024 for assistance with making written submissions, and to inform any commission statutory information gathering initiatives.

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### Education and Training Reform Act 2006

Pursuant to section 2.6.29(1)(b) of the **Education and Training Reform Act 2006** (the Act), all registrations held by a person under Part 2.6 of the Act are cancelled if the person has been given a Working with Children (WWC) exclusion pursuant to the **Worker Screening Act 2020**.

Pursuant to section 2.6.29(3)(b) of the Act, a person whose registration is cancelled in these circumstances is disqualified from teaching in a school or an early childhood service and is not entitled to apply to be registered with the Institute for a period of five years after the date on which the WWC exclusion is given.

On 30 August 2024, Tahsin Alam, a 26-year-old male, was given a WWC exclusion pursuant to the **Worker Screening Act 2020**.

On 25 September 2024, Tahsin Alam ceased to be a registered teacher in accordance with section 2.6.29(1)(b) of the Act and was disqualified from teaching in a school or an early childhood service in accordance with section 2.6.29(3)(b) of the Act for a period of five years after the date on which the WWC exclusion was given.
