NOTICE CONTROLLING NAVIGATION IN THE VICINITY OF WORKS

Parks Victoria, as the declared waterway manager for the waters of the Maribyrnong River upstream of Shepherd Bridge on Footscray Road makes the following notice under section 211(1)(b)(i) of the **Marine Safety Act 2010** (the Act).

For the purposes of the works activity proposed by Marine & Civil Maintenance Pty Ltd to undertake anode replacement works to Lynchs Bridge on Ballarat Road on the Maribyrnong River, the navigation and movement of vessels is prohibited on the dates, times and from the waters detailed in Table 1 below, excluding vessels involved in the works.

Stage 2 Wednesday 20 November 2024 to Friday 22 November 2024		Southern section of Lynchs Bridge (Ballarat Road) on either side of the bridge extending approximately 60 metres on both sides of the bridge and approximately 50 metres into the river (southern bridge spans 3 to 5 closed) as marked by buoys.		Span 2 (northern arch), minimum 12 metres width navigable channel available for transit. One-lane traffic is available past the exclusion zone. Vessels travelling downstream have right of way. Transit only, no drifting, no stopping, no overtaking. Vessels are subject to the usual 5 knot speed limit.

The exclusion zone will be marked by unlit stringline buoys, lit water communication buoys fitted with 1–2 nm marine lanterns and lit warning signage on approach from both directions.
