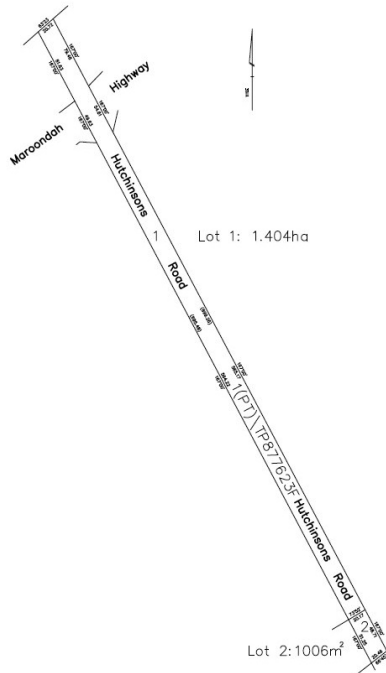

**NOTICE OF ROAD DISCONTINUATION**

In accordance with the **Road Management Act 2004** under section 12, and Schedule 10 (Clause 3) and section 223 of the **Local Government Act 1989**, Mansfield Shire Council, at a confidential meeting of Council held on 11 February 2025, resolved to discontinue road shown as a portion of land, identified as the corner of Hutchinsons Road and Nanda Court, Bonnie Doon.

The road to be discontinued is the land shown highlighted on the plan below, being part of the land contained in LOT 1(PT) / TP877623F (Closed Road).

When the Closed Road has been discontinued, the land comprising the Closed Road will then be sold by Council to the owners of the adjoining parcel of land as part of a private agreement between Council and the adjoining landowners.

#### EXEMPTION

Application No. H3461/2024

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the ‘Act’) by YWCA Housing (the ‘applicant’). The application for exemption is to enable the applicant:

To preference women aged 55 and over in considering future applications (including applications from existing residents other than those seeking a transfer application due to issues with their accommodation beyond their control relating to their safety, significant repairs or that makes their accommodation no longer tenable) for vacancies which arise in the YWCA Housing portfolio (the ‘exempt conduct’).

Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the two affidavits of Elizabeth van der Waal and the affidavit of Belinda Goglia, the evidence provided at the hearing on 31 March 2025 and the reasons provided in December 2021 in granting the previous exemption for the applicant, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from sections 52, 53, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

In granting this exemption, the Tribunal notes:

- The Constitution of YWCA Australia provides that its object is to 'provide benevolent relief to people experiencing poverty, homelessness, violence or disadvantage, in particular women and children, and to achieve this relief by activities including... providing emergency, social, affordable and community housing and associated support services for the relief of homelessness'. The Constitution of the applicant further recognises the need to provide affordable rental housing and accommodation to people on low income, and to promote the relief of poverty, sickness or the needs of the aged by providing affordable rental housing.
- The Victorian Department of Families Fairness and Housing administers the Victorian Housing Register ('VHR'), which is a register for all applicants seeking public or community housing in Victoria. The applicant has opted in to the VHR. The VHR has a Priority Access category, which includes special housing needs for those aged 55 and over.
- The applicant presently has two lease agreements that have age and gender limitations that are impacted by the requested exemption. Lease Agreement 1 is an agreement to operate short-term accommodation for women aged 55 years and over. Thirty-five rooms are provided in this accommodation at present. An exemption is required for this lease to continue in these terms, and a failure to gain an exemption would require the applicant to renegotiate Lease Agreement 1 and potentially lose the ability to operate the accommodation. Lease Agreement 2 is an agreement to operate a homelessness program providing accommodation for women aged 50 and over. Six rooms are available at present.

An exemption is required for this lease to continue in these terms, and a failure to gain an exemption would require the applicant to renegotiate Lease Agreement 2 and potentially lose the ability to operate the accommodation.

- YWCA is seeking to develop and construct its own affordable housing properties, and if successful in gaining funding, intends to allocate a percentage of these new dwellings to women aged 55 years and over.

The applicant has been granted an exemption in the past. The previous exemption was granted on 16 December 2021 and expired on 16 December 2024. An interim exemption was provided on 17 December 2024 until 13 April 2025.

The applicant has complied with the directions of the Tribunal to advertise the application for exemption and invite submissions from existing YWCA Housing renters, rooming house residents, prospective renters and residents and referral agencies. Evidence was provided regarding the circulation of the notice of the application as required by the Tribunal. Four written submissions were received in relation to the application, including three in favour and one against. Further information was provided by a resident who attended the hearing who was broadly in favour of the exemption continuing but wanted to ensure that existing rights of renters and rooming house residents were respected.

The Tribunal notes that the housing services that are provided by the applicant do in some circumstances support women and men. This includes women who are under 55 years of age. In the evidence before the Tribunal, YWCA states it has 268 active tenants, 252 identify as women, 12 identify as men and four identify as non-binary or transgender. Eighty-five of the active tenancies are occupied by people aged 55 and older, which represents 31% of the active renters. The applicant runs one mixed gender rooming house.

The affidavit of Elizabeth van der Waal provided information regarding the accommodation needs for women aged 55 years and older and I have taken this information into account in making my decision.

The Tribunal notes that the exemption that is being sought to be renewed does not

affect existing renters or rooming house residents who may be women under 55 years of age or men. The exemption also does not have to be used in all circumstances, and the applicant still has the opportunity to provide accommodation to a broader cohort of renters or rooming house residents, as determined by the applicant.

I accept that there are circumstances where the provision of services for vulnerable women 55 years and older should be given a preference in considering future accommodation applications.

Accordingly, it is appropriate that the exemption is granted. The granting of an exemption does not prohibit the applicant from housing women under 55 years of age or men, however it permits the preferencing of women aged 55 years and over in applications for housing. With respect to the preferencing of women over 55 years of age, in the absence of an exemption, the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination.

When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (the ‘Charter’). Arguably, this exemption limits the right to equality and, in particular, the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination of women under 55 and men. I am satisfied that, in the circumstances discussed above, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption from the operation of sections 52, 53, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 1 April 2030.

**5 Prohibitions, restrictions and conditions**

- (a) The entry or importation into Victoria of any host material is prohibited.
- (b) Sub-clause (a) does not apply if the host material –
  - (i) originates from an area for which there is currently in force an area freedom certificate issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory from which the material originated, certifying that the area from which the material originated is known to be free of citrus tristeza virus; or
  - (ii) enters Victoria under and in accordance with a permit issued by an inspector and there is compliance with any conditions or requirements set out in the permit.

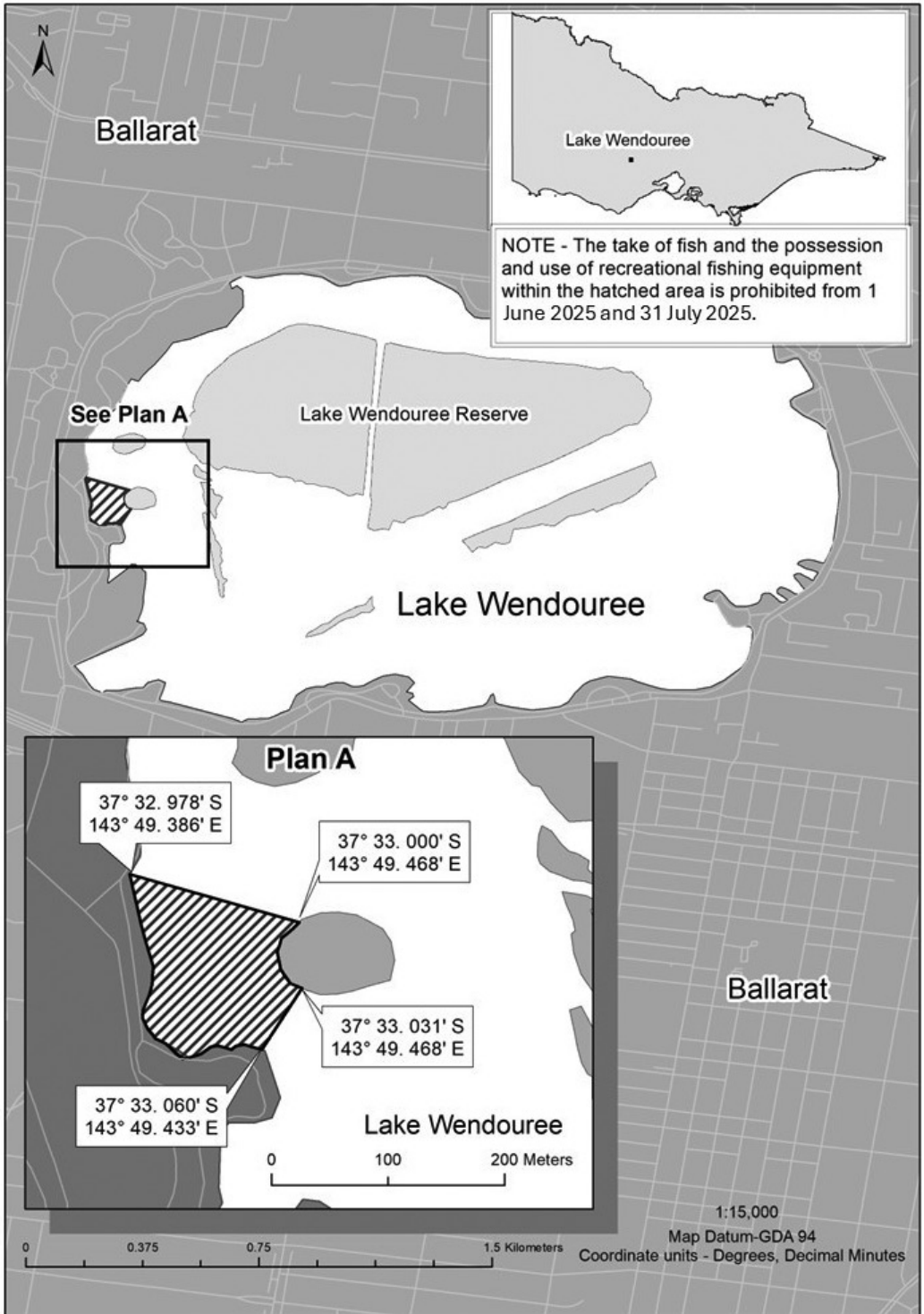
Unless sooner revoked, this Notice will be automatically revoked 12 months after the day on which it comes into operation.

**Notes:**

Contravention of any prohibition under section 67 of the Act set out in this Fisheries Notice is an offence under section 67(3) of the Act. A maximum penalty of 100 penalty units or six months imprisonment or both applies.

Contravention of any prohibition under section 114 of the Act set out in this Fisheries Notice is an offence under section 114(3) of the Act. A maximum penalty of 100 penalty units or six months imprisonment or both applies.

## FISHERIES (MACQUARIE PERCH) NOTICE 2025

**1. Title**

This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Macquarie perch) Notice 2025.

**2. Objectives**

The objectives of this Notice is to change the bag limit for Macquarie perch to zero in order to protect Macquarie perch in all waters across Victoria.

**3. Authorising provision**

This Notice is made under sections 67 and 152 of the Act.

**4. Commencement**

This Notice comes into operation on the day it is published in the Victoria Government Gazette.

**5. Definitions and interpretive provisions**

In this Notice –

‘*Macquarie perch*’ means *Macquaria australasica*;

‘*the Regulations*’ means the Fisheries Regulations 2019;

‘*the Act*’ means the **Fisheries Act 1995**.

**6. Taking and possession of Macquarie perch prohibited**

(1) For the purposes of section 67(1) of the Act, the taking of Macquarie perch from Victorian waters is prohibited.

(2) For the purposes of section 67(1) of the Act, the possession of Macquarie perch anywhere in Victoria is prohibited.

(3) For the purposes of the Act, the daily catch limit with respect to –

(a) the taking of Macquarie perch from Victorian waters; or

(b) the possession of Macquarie perch anywhere in Victoria –

is 0 Macquarie perch.

**Note:** There are offences in sections 68A and 68B of the Act relating to taking or possessing more fish of a species than the catch limit specified in a Fisheries Notice. Various penalties apply.

(4) Sub-clauses (1), (2) and (3) do not apply to –

(a) the Victorian Fisheries Authority or a person acting on behalf of the authority for compliance, fisheries management or research purposes; or

(b) a person acting under a general permit that authorises the taking or possession of Macquarie perch who takes or possesses the Macquarie perch in accordance with the permit, the Act and the Regulations.

- (5) Sub-clauses (2) and 3(a) do not apply to a person acting under a licence or permit issued under section 53 of the **Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988** that authorises the keeping of Macquarie perch who possesses the Macquarie perch in accordance with the licence or permit, the Act and the Regulations.

## 7. Revocation

Unless sooner revoked, this Notice will be automatically revoked 12 months after the day on which it comes into operation.

### Notes:

Section 152(3) of the Act provides that if a Fisheries Notice is inconsistent with any regulations, management plan, Ministerial direction, licence or permit, the Fisheries Notice prevails to the extent of the inconsistency.

### FISHERIES (MANAGEMENT OF LAKE HUME) NOTICE 2025

#### 1. Title

This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Management of Lake Hume) Notice 2025.

#### 2. Objectives

The objectives of this Notice are to provide for the management of Lake Hume by exempting a person who has paid the recreational fishing fee as required under the **Fisheries Management Act 1994** of New South Wales from the requirement of holding a recreational fishing licence while fishing in Lake Hume.

#### 3. Authorising provision

This Notice is made under section 152 of the Act.

#### 4. Commencement

This Notice comes into operation on the day it is published in the Government Gazette.

#### 5. Definitions

In this Fisheries Notice –

**‘engaging in recreational fishing’** means –

- (a) taking or attempting to take fish; or
- (b) using or possessing recreational fishing equipment;

**‘Lake Hume’** has the same meaning as in the Fisheries Regulations 2019;

**‘the Act’** means the **Fisheries Act 1995**.

#### 6. Exemption from the requirement to hold a recreational fishery licence

(1) A person who is engaging in recreational fishing in or on lake Hume is exempt from the requirement to hold a recreational fishery licence under section 44 of the Act in respect of that fishing if –

- (a) the person has paid the NSW fishing fee in accordance with Division 4A of the **Fisheries Management Act 1994** of New South Wales; and

- (b) the payment is current and valid; and
  - (c) the person has an official receipt for the payment of the NSW fishing fee in his or her immediate possession.
- (2) For the purposes of this clause, a person has an official receipt in his or her **‘immediate possession’** only if the person is able to immediately produce the official receipt for inspection if required.

**7. Requirement to produce official receipt**

An authorised officer may require a person who claims to have paid the NSW fishing fee to produce the official receipt in respect of that payment for inspection.

**Note:** it is an offence under section 111(1)(i) of the Act to fail to comply with a lawful requirement of an authorised officer.

**8. Revocation**

Unless sooner revoked, this Notice is revoked on the day which is 12 months after the date on which it came into operation.

- 1. Title**  
This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Roach and Tench Catch Limit) Notice 2025.
- 2. Objective**  
The objective of this Notice is to fix catch and possession limits for recreational take of roach and tench across Victorian waters.
- 3. Authorising provision**  
This Notice is made under section 152 of the Act.
- 4. Commencement**  
This Notice comes into operation on the day its published in the Victoria Government Gazette.
- 5. Definitions**  
In this Fisheries Notice –  
**‘roach’** means *Rutilus rutilus*;  
**‘tench’** means *Tinca tinca*;  
**‘the Act’** means the **Fisheries Act 1995**.
- 6. Catch and possession limit**  
Despite regulation 161(3) of the Fisheries Regulations 2019, in the case of roach and tench, there is no limit on the possession or the taking of these species of fish from Victorian waters.



**7. Revocation**

Unless sooner revoked, this Notice will be automatically revoked 12 months after the day on which it comes into operation.

**Notes:**

Section 152(3) of the Act provides that if a Fisheries Notice is inconsistent with any regulations, management plan, Ministerial direction, licence or permit, the Fisheries Notice prevails to the extent of the inconsistency.

Penalties under this notice are set in accordance with section 152(7)(c) of the Act which allow the imposition of penalties not exceeding 50 penalty units for a contravention of an offence under a fisheries notice.
