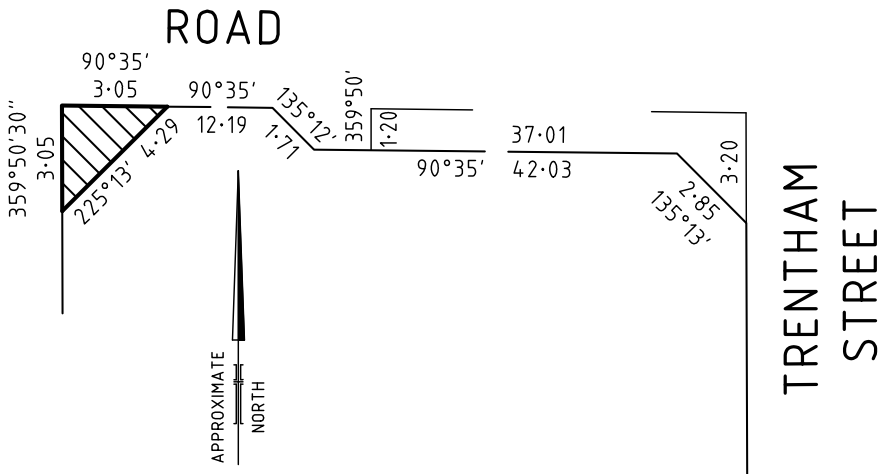
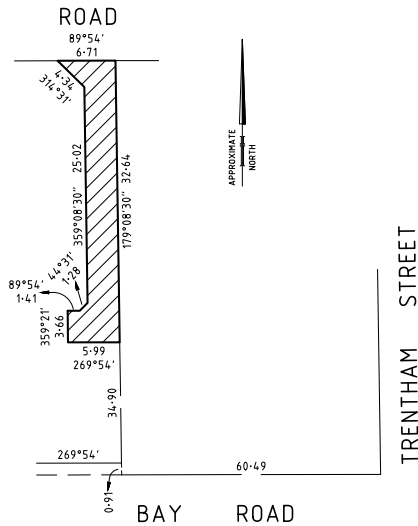

ORDER MADE PURSUANT TO THE **DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT 1994**  
SECTION 25 AND 26

Passed by Council Resolution, 21 April 2026

This Order revokes all previous Orders of Council by Mount Alexander Shire Council made under the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**.

In accordance with the **Domestic Animals Act 1994**, from 21 April 2026 dogs and cats are to be controlled in the following manner at all times:

Pursuant to section 25 cats within the municipality are to be controlled:

**Cat Curfew**

All cats within the municipality must be securely confined to their owners' premises at all times (24 hours per day). This requirement replaces any previous sunset-to-sunrise curfew.

A person may exercise a cat in a public place only if the cat is kept on a chain, cord or leash held by the person and attached to the cat at all times.

Pursuant to section 26(2) dogs and cats within the municipality are to be controlled:

**On-Leash**

The person in control of any dog must keep the dog in effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash held by the person and attached to the dog while the dog is in:

- all roads\* in the areas of Campbells Creek, Castlemaine, Chewton and Maldon prescribed in Schedule 1; and
- the Castlemaine Botanical Garden; and all other parks and reserves:
  - between sunset to 6.00 am; and
  - when park maintenance is being performed; and
- the principal location of an organised public meeting, sporting or community event, or festival when occurring or being prepared for; and
- within five metres of a permanent barbeque or picnic area when in use; and
- at any place where Council has placed signs indicating that dogs must be on a lead.

A person may exercise a cat in a public place but must keep the cat on a chain, cord or leash held by the person attached to the cat at all times.

**Off-Leash**

With the exception of the above, a dog may be exercised off-lead providing the person in control actively supervises the dog and maintains a clear and unobstructed view of the dog at all times, and:

- carries a chain, cord or leash sufficient to bring the dog under effective control if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal; or
- remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog so as to be able to bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash if that becomes necessary; or
- is in a prescribed dog park and places the dog on-lead when exiting the park.

\*Roads as the meaning is ascribed to it in the **Local Government Act 1989**.

**Prohibited areas**

Dogs are prohibited at all times:

- within five metres of any playground;
  - from the playing surfaces of the following:
    - Camp Reserve Oval, Castlemaine;
    - Castlemaine War Memorial Stadium;
    - Elsie Palmer Field Oval, Castlemaine;
    - Doug Powell Oval, Castlemaine;
    - Wesley Hill Recreation Reserve, Castlemaine;
    - Campbells Creek Recreation Reserve Oval;
    - Chewton Soldiers Memorial Park Oval;
    - John Powell Recreation Reserve Oval, Guildford;
    - Harcourt Recreation Reserve and Leisure Centre Oval;
    - Cricket Ground and Recreation Reserve Oval, Newstead;
    - Bill Woodfull Reserve Oval, Maldon;
    - Public Recreation Reserve Station Oval, Taradale; and
  - at any place where Council has placed signs indicating that dogs are prohibited.
- Pursuant to section 26(2A) dogs within the municipality are to be controlled:

**By Agreement with owner of private land**

The person in control of any dog must keep the dog in effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash held by the person and attached to the dog while the dog is on:

- 149 Duke Street, Castlemaine (Wesley Hill Market).

Pursuant to section 26(4) a condition as to the means of restraint of a dog does not apply to a dog in any circumstances listed in section 20(2).

**Exemptions to Order of Council**

A dog that is an Assistant Animal within the meaning of the **Disability Discrimination Act 1992** (Cth) that is under the effective control of the handler/patient.

A dog may be temporarily tethered to a post or pole on a short leash or chain while the person in control of the dog conducts a short-term activity provided the dog's behaviour is monitored and immediate action is taken to bring the dog under control.

An Authorised Officer may temporarily suspend or amend a provision of this Order for the purposes of facilitating a planned event or in an emergency.

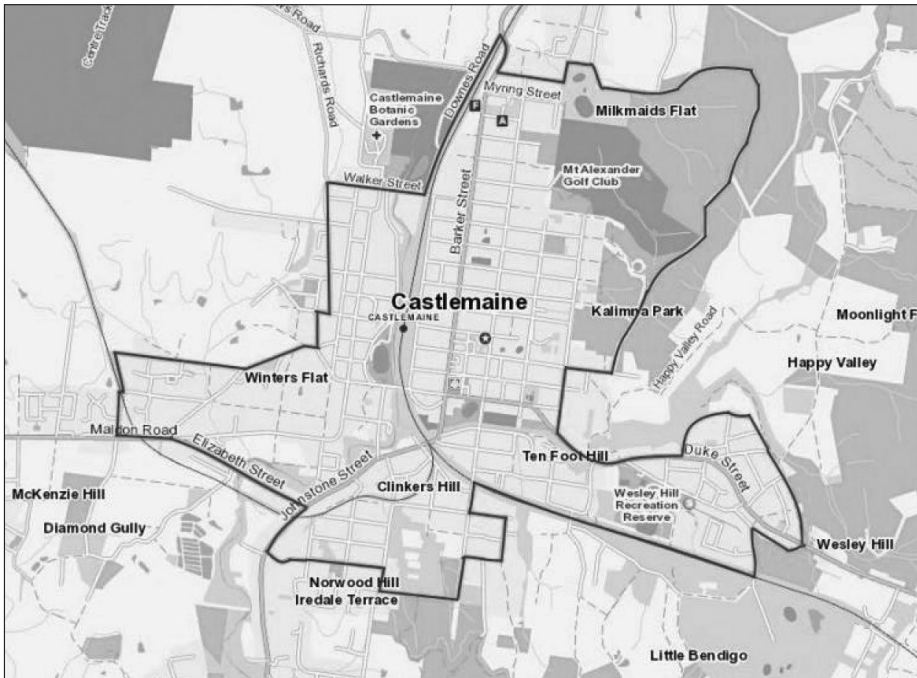

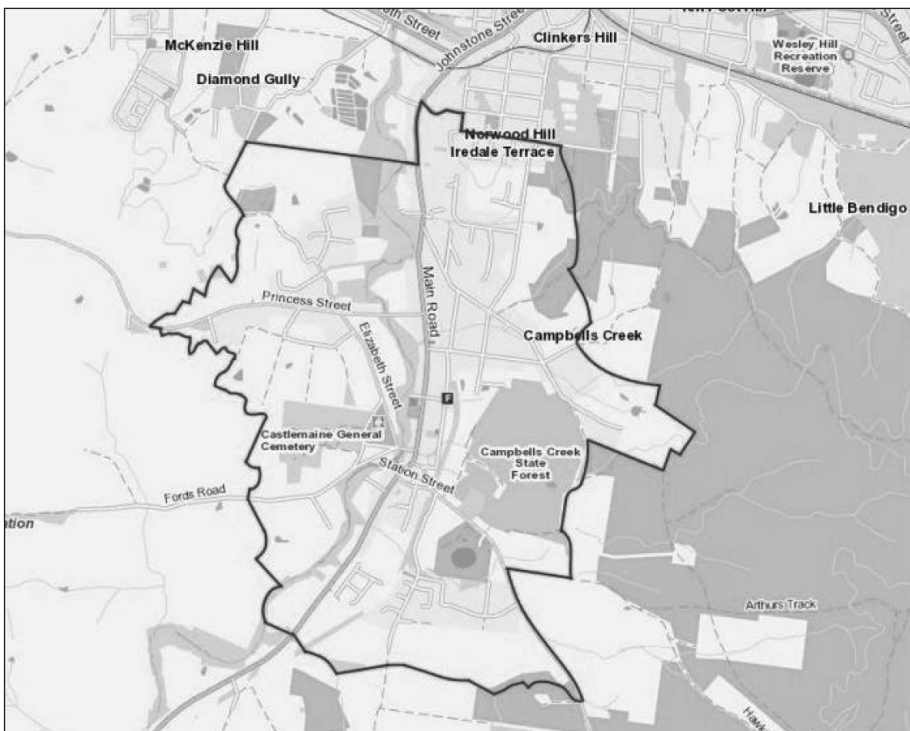

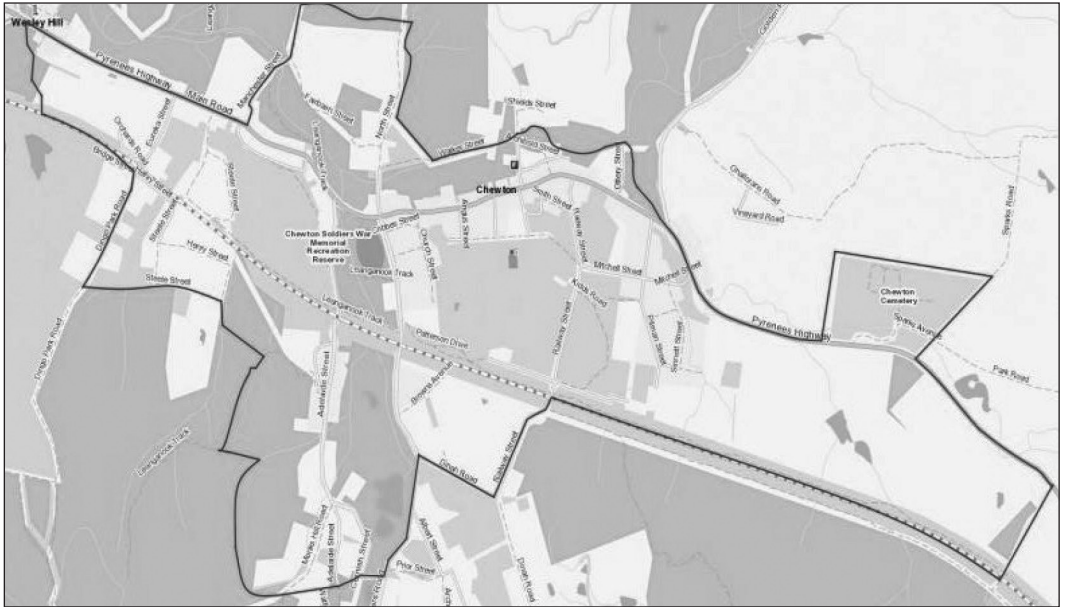
Castlemaine prescribed on-leash area



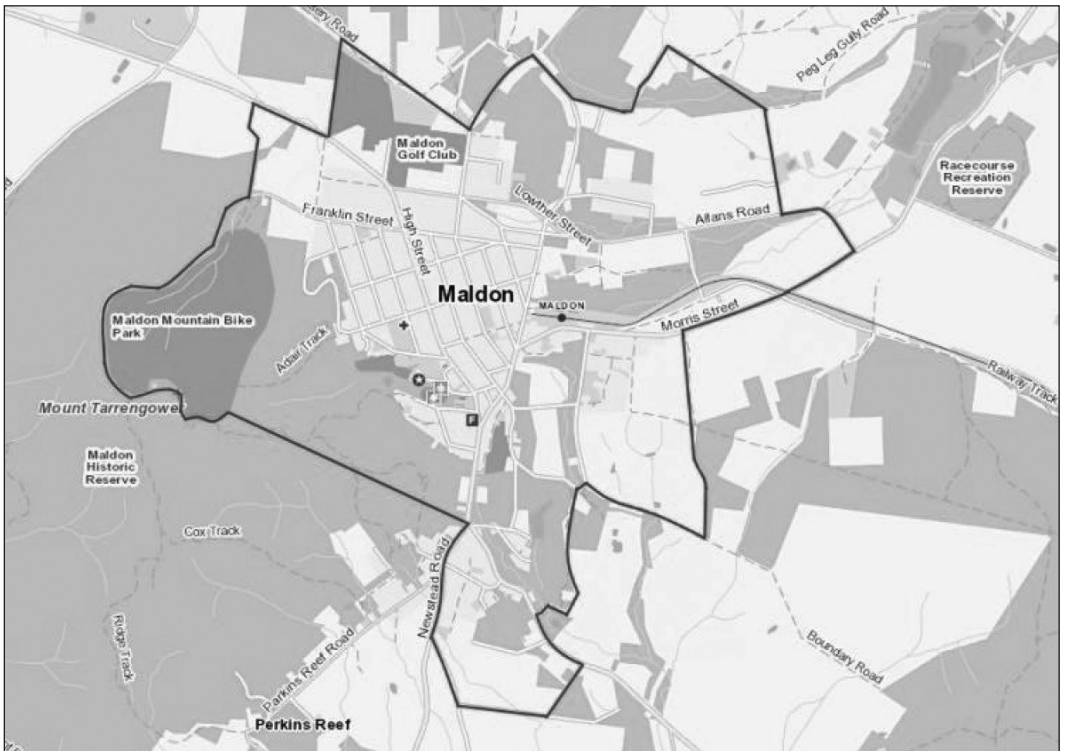
Campbells Creek prescribed on-leash area

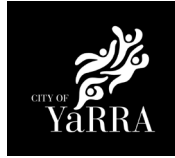


Chewton prescribed on-leash area



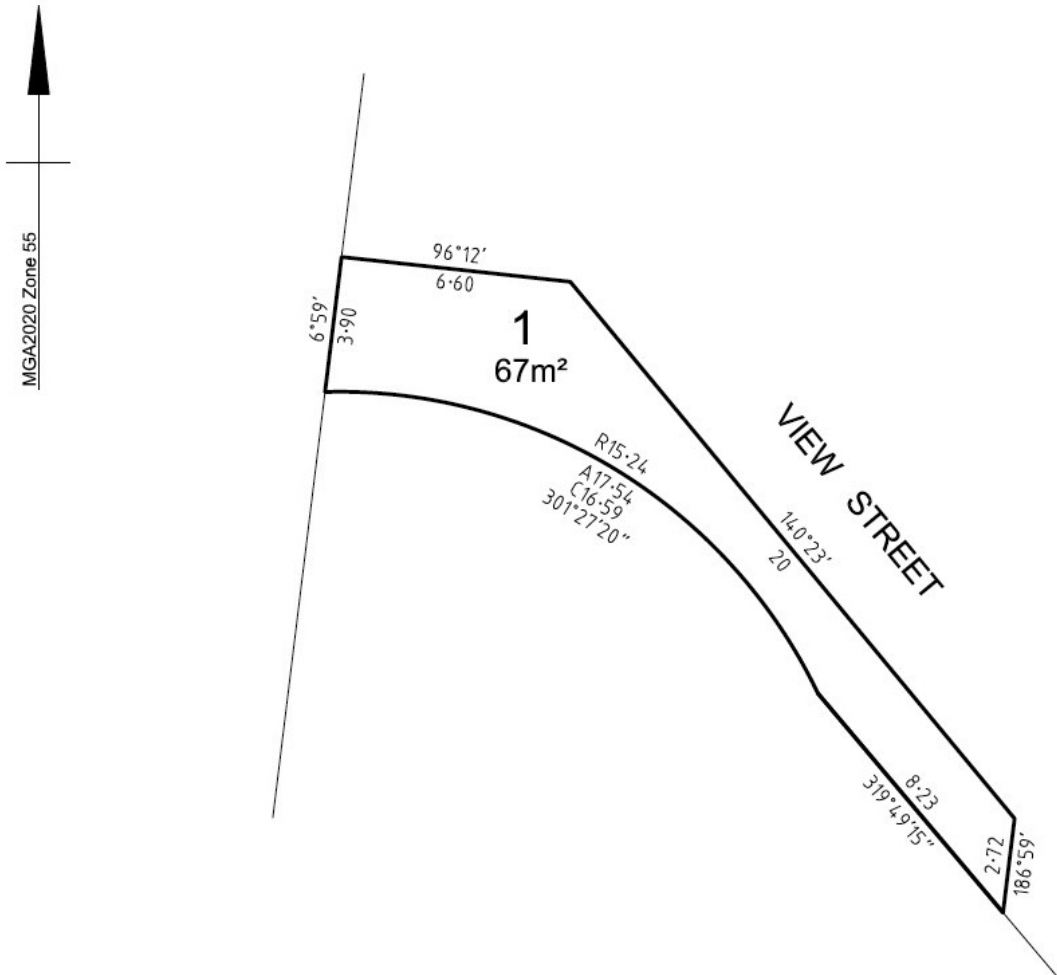

**Overview**

The Amendment will implement updated flood mapping produced since structural mitigation works were completed within the Buloke Shire Council. Some areas of the Floodway Overlay (FO) and Land Subject to Inundation Overlay (LSIO) will be deleted within the township of Donald. Minor areas of the Urban Floodway Zone (UFZ) will be replaced with the Township Zone (TZ) in Charlton. The mapping extents were advised from the North Central Catchment Management Authority (CMA), and the Donald Flood and Drainage Management Plan (GHD, 2013) and Charlton Flood and Drainage Management Plan (BMT, WBM, 2014) which were adopted as background documents via Amendment C027 in 2018.

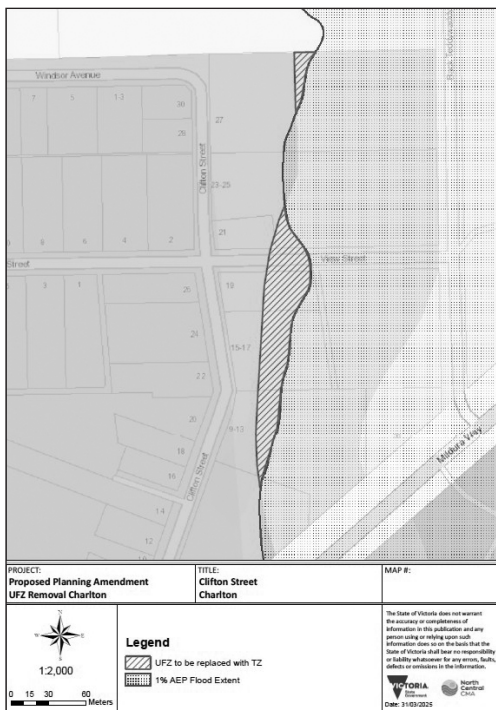


Figure 1: Charlton existing UFZ to be replaced with TZ.

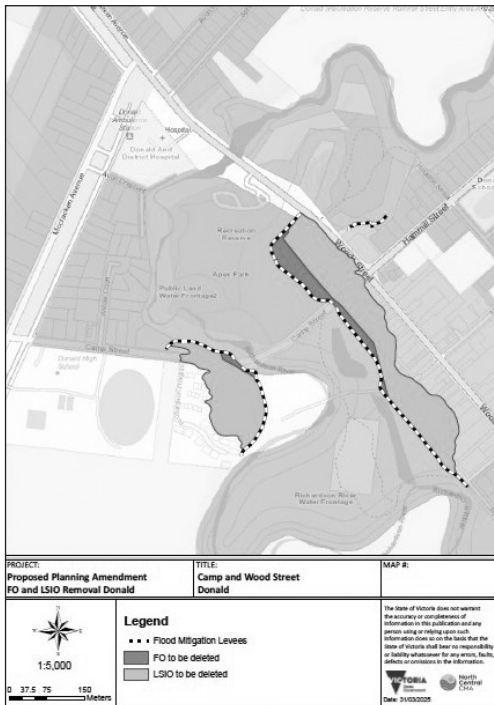


Figure 2: Donald FO and LSIO to be deleted

### EXEMPTION

#### APPLICATION No. H365/2025

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal ('VCAT') has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** ('the Act') by Linfox Australia Pty Ltd ('the applicant') for an exemption from sections 16, 18, 21, 105, 107 and 182 of the Act.

VCAT notes that in 2015 and 2020, the applicant was granted a similar exemption to the one considered here. The last exemption lasted for five years in accord with the limits in the Act. The application in this proceeding relates to the same contract ('the contract') as affected the applications in 2015 and 2020. Under the contract, entered into by the applicant in December 2013, and subsequently extended, the applicant provides services to the Australian Defence Force. From time to time the applicant also tenders for or enters into other contracts, either as a contractor or subcontractor, with the Commonwealth of Australia, the Australian Defence Force, the United States Government or a military department of the United States Government that contain terms which are the same or substantially similar to the security clearance and related requirements of the contract. In order for the applicant to meet its contractual obligations and be able under relevant Commonwealth law to provide the contracted services, it may only engage employees and contract workers who are Australian citizens. Unless an exemption is granted that conduct involves race-based discrimination contrary to the Act.

A copy of the current application for exemption was sent to the Victorian Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission ('the Commission'), which did not seek leave to intervene in the proceeding.

In December 2025, VCAT extended the 2020 exemption to June 2026, to allow time for the current application to be advertised and submissions made.

In December 2025, VCAT directed the applicant to publish notice of the application and to notify its employees and contractors and the unions who represent its employees about the exemption application and that they could make submissions to VCAT about it. The affidavit of Lauren Mazurek confirmed that the applicant has complied with the directions about notice. VCAT received no submissions.

Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the affidavit of James Pereira and the affidavit of Lauren Mazurek, and for essentially the same reasons as were set out in VCAT's reasons for decision published in relation to the exemption granted on 23 April 2015 to the applicant on almost the same terms as this exemption and about the same class of activities, VCAT is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption in the terms sought.

The conditions for the exemption, to which the applicant agrees, are set out in Schedule 1 and include reporting to VCAT and the Commission, to increase accountability.

1. Pursuant to section 89(1) of the Act and subject to the conditions contained in Schedule 1, an exemption is granted to the applicant from the operation of sections 16, 18, 21, 105, 107 and 182 of the Act for the period 20 August 2020 to 19 September 2025.
2. The exemption is granted in respect of the operation of sections 16, 18, 21, 105, 107 and 182 of the Act insofar as those sections relate to the 'race' (as that attribute is defined in section 4 of the Act) of members of the applicant's Workforce.
3. The class of activities for which the exemption is granted is:
  - (a) requiring members or potential members of the Workforce to provide details of their citizenship (including any changes to their citizenship) to enable the applicant to determine whether they are permitted under the Security Requirements to participate in

the provision of the Services or to have access to Defence Materials;

- (b) disclosing information about the citizenship of members of the Workforce to:
  - (i) the United States Department of State;
  - (ii) the Australian Department of Defence; or
  - (iii) any other organisation or government department for which or on whose behalf or at whose request the applicant undertakes work in respect of which the applicant has (directly or indirectly) an obligation not to transfer Defence Materials on the basis of citizenship;
- (c) maintaining a list, with distribution limited to only those officers and employees with a need to know, of members of the Workforce who are permitted by virtue of their citizenship to participate in the provision of the Services or have access to related Defence Materials so as to distinguish them from members of the Workforce who are not so permitted;
- (d) distinguishing, by means of pass coded in a manner that does not refer to citizenship, whether a member of the Workforce has the necessary security clearance to participate in the provision of the Services or have access to related Defence Materials, so as to distinguish them from members of the Workforce who are not so permitted;
- (e) restricting access to Defence Materials connected with the Services to particular members of the Workforce based on their citizenship;
- (f) restricting access to areas of its facilities connected with the provision of the Services to particular members of the Workforce based on their citizenship;
- (g) entering into agreements with the applicant's employees, contractors, agents and consultants pursuant to which those third parties undertake to comply with the Security Requirements, and to take all practicable steps to

- assist the applicant in complying with the Security Requirements;
- (h) rejecting applications to join the Workforce in positions relating to the provision of the Services or requiring access to the Defence Materials based on the job applicant's citizenship, and taking into account a person's citizenship in determining who should be offered employment or contract work requiring access to Defence Materials;
- (i) transferring members of the Workforce from the provision of the Services to work in other parts of the applicant's business on the basis that, due to their citizenship (including a change to their citizenship), the applicant may not permit them to participate in the provision of the Services;
- (j) terminating the employment or engagement of members of the Workforce on the basis that:
- (i) due to their citizenship (including a change to their citizenship), the applicant may not permit them to participate in the provision of the Services; and
- (ii) it is not reasonable in all the circumstances to redeploy or transfer the members of the Workforce to another role within the applicant's business, or within a business operated by one of the applicant's associated entities; and
- (k) advertising positions within the Workforce as being open only to Australian citizens who can obtain the necessary clearances for access to the Defence Materials.

In this exemption:

'Defence Materials' means any materials or information in relation to which access or use is regulated by the Security Requirements.

'Security Requirements' means:

- (a) requirements made by the Australian Government, that Government's Department of Defence or any other department of that Government, including:

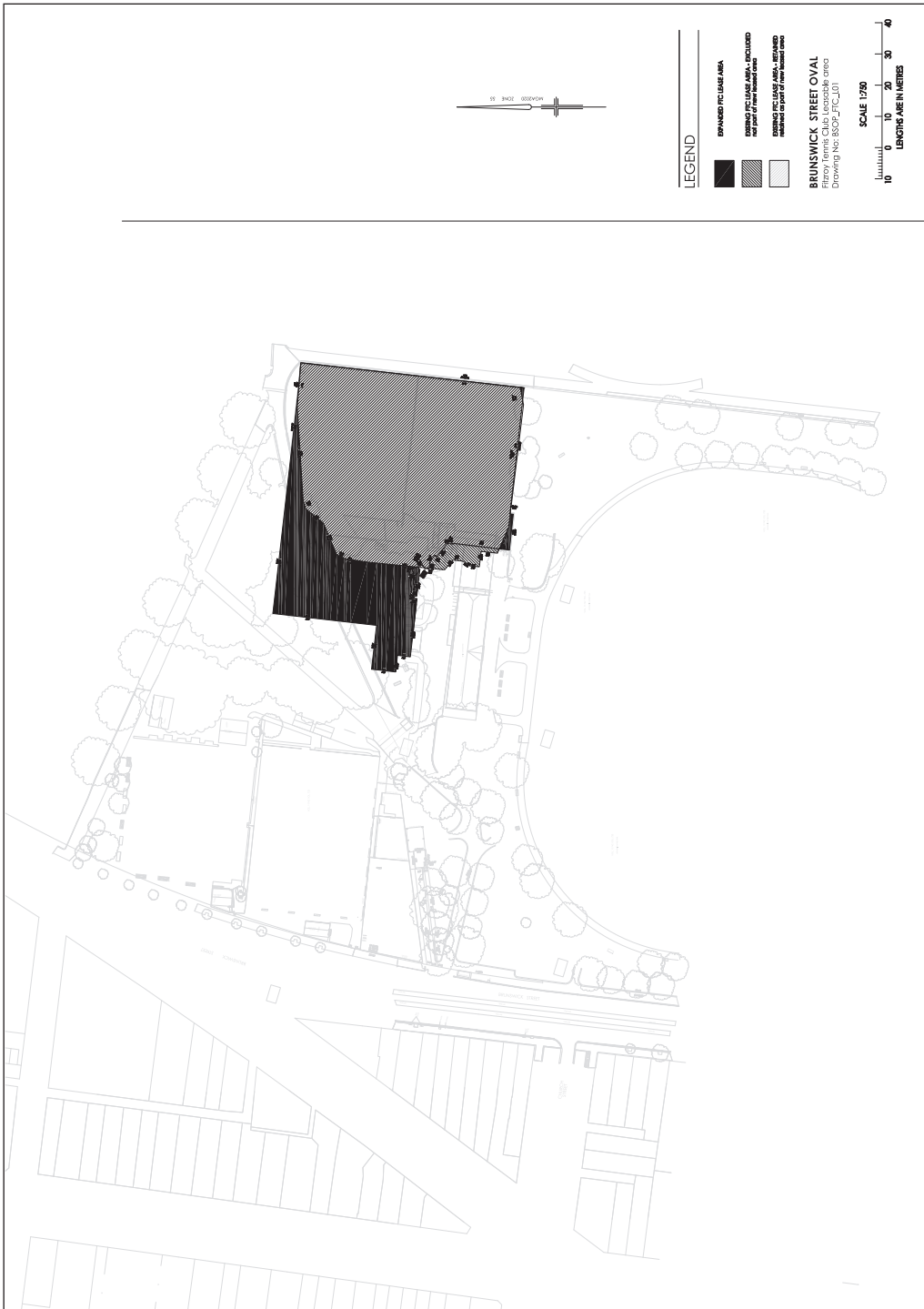

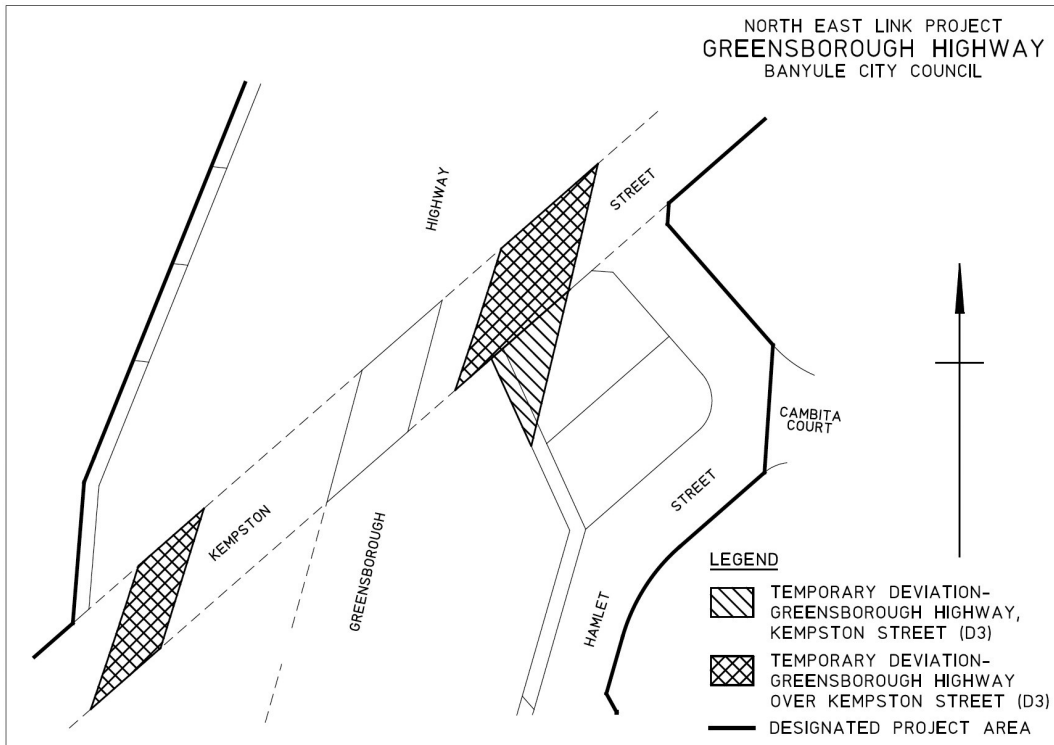

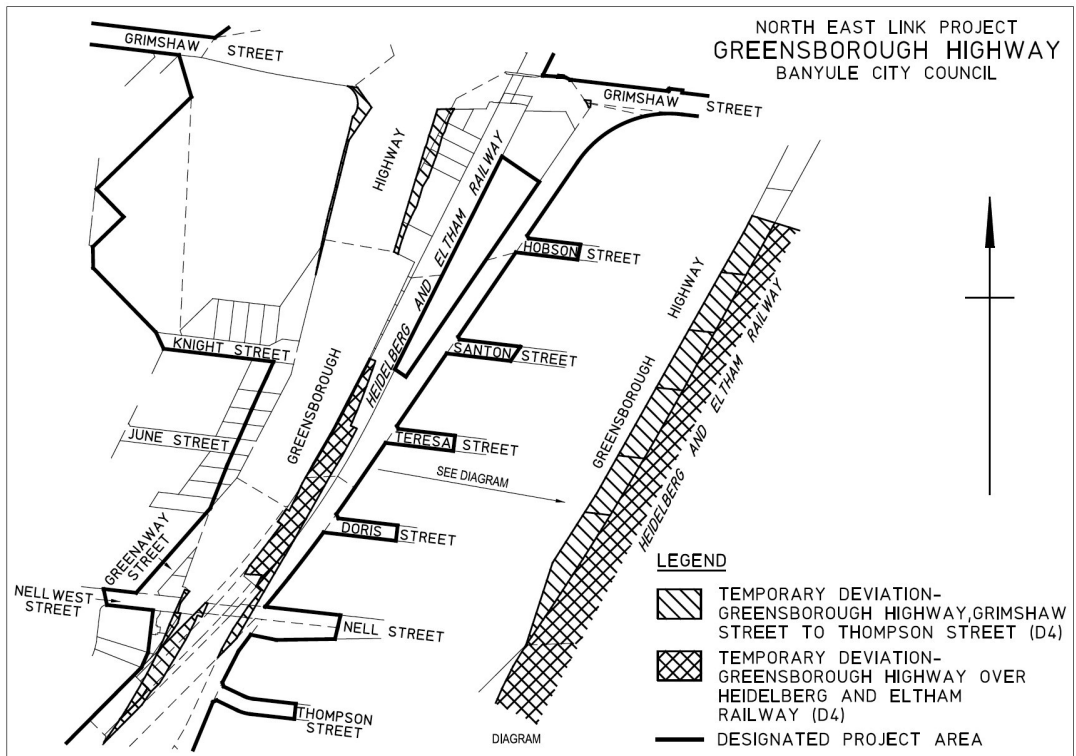
